# Scoutmaster, 71, sentenced to eight years for sex crimes

37 A 71-year-old Boy Scout leader, whose admitted sodomy of a young boy six Lyears ago went unreported at the time, was sentenced. Thursday to eight years. vin prison for four new felony sex crimes. ragainst two young scouts.

Henry Lee Pugh of Modesto, a scoutmaster for the last five years, pleaded guilty to sodomizing, orally copulating and molesting an 11-year-old member of his troop. > Deputy probation officer Steven I. Pierce reported Pugh admitted being caught in the act of sodomy with a boy I or 12 years old about six years ago. Pugh, who said he was an active church member, told Pierce he confessed the act to his pastor. On Pughis promise to obtain treatment, the pastor agreed not to report the incident to police, he said: Pugh failed to obtain counseling; according to the report.

In the presentence interview, Pugh told Pierce he engaged in sexual activities with boys because he was physically unable to have sex with his wife. He claimed the boys were responsive to the acts and in some instances initiated

- Pugh denied allegations by the victims' parents that he became involved in scouting to gain access to young boys. and that he discouraged older boys from : involvement in the group.

The father of one victim said he offered to assist Pugh with the scout troop but Pugh rejected his application.

He said it has been 16 months since sheriff's deputies have received a pay raise and union members voted 4-1 against the county's last contract offer.

Baugh claimed sheriff's deputies are paid \$300 a month less than Modesto Police Department officers.

Top pay for a sheriff's deputy or detective is \$2,075 a month compared to a Modesto policeman's monthly pay of \$2,313 and a Modesto detective's pay of \$2,551. Modesto officers recently received an annual raise under a five-year contract that includes cost-of-living increases.

County personnel officer and chief negotiator Philip Rosenberg said Modesto officers have more take-home pay because they opted out of Social Security and get higher uniform allowances.
