Fire injures men

An Independence man is listed in serious condition after gasoline spilled near a hot water heater. causing a flash fire Monday.

Norman L. Laughlin, 32, of 10400 Sheley Road, is in the intensive care unit at the Independence Sanitarium and Hospital, a hospital spokeswoman said this morning. He suffered burns to his arms, chest, face, legs and abdomen, Independence police said.

His father, Lloyd Laughlin, 72, of the same address, was treated for burns at the Veteran's Administration Hospital, Kansas City, and released.

Independence police said the two men had been cleaning themselves and tools with gasoline after working on the roof of their house.

The fire caused minor damage to the house.

Sitter faces charges

A former baby sitter has been charged with two counts of sodomy based on interviews by the Independence Police Department with two boys.

Francisco A. Pienn Jr., 33, of 1421 W. Walnut St., was arraigned Monday before Judge James May of the Jackson County Associate Circuit Court. Picon is being held on \$30,000 bond in the Jackson County Jail and awaits a preliminary hearing on Thursday.

An 11-year-old Independence boy told police the suspect had deviant sexual intercourse with him twice on July 1 and sometime between June 7-13-82 Indep, Examine,

The mother of a 5-year-old Inlependence boy told police the suspect had baby-sat her son in recent weeks. She told police she had to break a front door lock to gain admittance to her home earlier this month. Upon entering, she found Picon and her son asleep in bed.

Independence Police Capt. John Vaughn said he doesn't expect the 5-year-old to press charges. "At 5, you can hardly testify," he said.

After careful review, we have decided that your registration with the Boy Scouts of America should not be accepted. We are therefore compelled to request that you sever any relations that you may have with the Boy Scouts of America.

You should understand that BSA leadership registration is a privilege and is not automatically granted to everyone who applies. We reserve the right to refuse registration whenever there is a concern that an individual may not measure up to the high standards of leadership which the BSA seeks to provide for American youth. Please also understand that this decision and the reasons for it will be maintained as confidential.

If you wish to have this decision reviewed, please write to me, explaining your version of the facts supporting your claim that your registration as a USA leader should be granted or reinstated.

Over the past two months I have been aware of several behavior problems concerning Frank Picon. The last of which has led me to ask Frank to resign at Cubmaster of Pack 422 Edgewood Congregation, RLDS Church.

From personal experience I am aware that Mr. Picon has taken money from both Pack 422 and Pack 464. The amount of money from Pack 464 is \$11.82 while the amount from Pack 422 is undetermined. While we were associated with Pack 464 Mr. Picon was asked to sell aluminum cans that the Cubs had collected. After several months of waiting for this to be done, I became suspicious when upon visiting at Frank's I could not locate the cans he said were there. After several discussions with Frank I discovered that he had sold the cans and had purchased beer with it. This story was verified by the second gentlemen that was involved with this incident.

Mr. Picon also sees nothing wrong with taking that which is not his to take. This can be anything from a book, a glass, a car, or any one of various items. The car was a 1980 Cadalic, left in our driveway by friends. We were only aware that Frank had used the car when we received a call from Phoenix, Arizona asking about the 115 miles put on the car while at our house. Upon inquiring of Frank concerning this, he did admitt taking the car, but could see nothing wrong in what he did. The six glasses are mine and we still don't know if we will get them back. The books belong to various individuals and I really do not have any idea about their return.

Throughout all of the above incidents, we have had to deal with his lying, which as become more apparent as time goes on. I feel it is now to the point that Mr. Picon may not know the difference between the truth and a lie. We have mail at my house addressed to both Mr. Frank A. Picon and Mr. Frank P. Burgos. Both addressed to Frank's address 1428 W. Walnut "C". Frank as told us that he uses both names, but we do not know his real name.

In discussing these various problems with Mr. Tom Herron, Scouting Coordinator of Sugar Creek RLDS Church, I learned that the Troop 464 had also lost money to Mr. Frank Picon sometime earlier.

I was willing to work with Mr. Picon as long as he made restitution for the taken money, and never lied to me again. Over the last two months all of the above problems have been getting worse.

The last incident which I become aware of last week was of such nature that I insisted that Frank resign as Cubmaster. This last incident was of such nature that I believe, as do the parents of several boys involved, that Mr. Picon should in no way be involved with boys especially while in the Boy Scouts of America. We believe in wholesome relationships, adults with boys, not that which Mr. Picon seems to believe he wants. The boys, so far as we know, are between the ages of eight and fourteen, most are cubs or scouts with at least one a non-scouter. I can in no way trust him with my children and I will not trust him with the Boys in my Pack or Troop. This particular trait is not condusive to good mental health.

I would request that this information would be circulated as you felt the need for others to know.
