Stremler entered his plea before Judge Gary Haman and the trial date was set, according to Greg Keller, Benewah County prosecutor. Stremler was represented by Tom Morris of St. Maries. Also during law day, Barry Pringle, formerly of St. Maries, was bound over to district court by Magistrate Richard Mc-Fadden. Pringle is charged with lewd conduct with a minor, a felony. Nov. 12 was set as the date for his arraignment.

Grant-func. Udager sentenced on topics of Salcohol-driving charge

Grant money - leftover and verrun — was among the items liscussed by the St. Maries city council at its meeting Nov. 9.

Uses for the grant money left over from a recent sewer line replacement project are being studied by city crew supervisor Phil Brown and Larry Comer of V. David Welch Engineering. Comer has been the engineer on the sewer line project that replaced and installed sewer lines in portions of Parker's addition and Old Government Townsite area this summer and ∄all.

The federal Department of Housing and Urban development offered the city \$200,900 in grant money for the project. Because construction bids came in lower than expected. and because of cost-saving measures during the project, there is money left over which the city can use, with certain restrictions.

Concerning another grantfunded project, a cost overrun of \$15,000 is expected on the lesign work for the pumping and piping for the city's two Riverdale wells, and \$18,000 for ngineering during struction.
