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

MOTION FOR REDUCTION IN BAIL

NOW COMES David J. Brunette, Defendant in the above, who moves that bail in the above matter, presently set in the amount of \$350.00 on each of two complaints, be reduced to \$350.00 personal recognizance, assigning as grounds, therefore, the following:

- 1. That the Defendant was charged with two complaints alleging indecent exposure under RSA 645:1 and charged one complaint alleging endangering the welfare of a child under RSA 639:3, returnable to the Conway District Court; that the Defendant, by motion dated April 26, 1983, which motion was granted on May 3, 1983, moved for a change of venue from the Conway District Court to the Portsmouth District Court.
- 2. That after jurisdiction of the three misdemeanor was assumed by the Portsmouth District Court, trial was held on said three misdemeanors on or about June 16, 1983; that bail on said three misdemeanor charges was set in a total amount of \$1,500 personal recognizance; that after trial the Court took the matter under advisement and the matter was to be reassigned for disposition and sentencing, if any, at a later date.
- 3. That from the time of the entry of said appeal and until the date of disposition and sentencing, on August 2, 1983, bail remained

- 4. That on August 2, 1983, at a hearing in the Portsmouth District Court, the Court made a finding of guilty on each of the three complaints.
- 5. That the Court then <u>sua sponte</u> increased bail to \$350 cash on one indecent exposure complaint and \$350 cash on the endangering the welfare of a child complaint; that the State, at that time, had no recommendation to make on the bail question.
- 6. That the Defendant lives in Kittery, Maine, and works at the Portsmouth Naval Shippard and has lived in the Kittery--Portsmouth area for in excess of ten years.
- 7. That the Defendant has never defaulted on any Court appearance and has no criminal record in New Hampshire or elsewhere.
- 8. That there exists no particular facts or circumstances making the Defendants failure to appear likely.
- 9. That Detective Brian Hester, detective with the New Hampshire State Police who prosecuted these cases in Portsmouth District Court, has no objection to this Motion for Reduction in Bail to the amount previously set.
- 10. That counsel for the Defendant, in a phone conversation at 1:00 p.m. on August 2, 1983, learned that the Rockingham County Attorney's Office objects to the granting of this Motion on the
