



esting foster children

NORFOLK - A former foster father who housed children for 17 years was ordered Monday to serve seven years in prison for molesting three girls who lived in his home.

George W. Wentz, 56, had pleaded guilty June 20 to two counts of aggravated sexual battery and one count of sodomy before Circuit Court Judge Joseph E. Baker. He faced a maximum of 45 years in prison.
"I did it: I've got to take responsi-

bility," Wentz testified Monday before Baker pronounced sentence."
The girls have been harmed for life. I want to pay society for what I have done."

Weniz said he was repulsed by his. actions and was ready to be punished for them. All three of the girls Tages 11, 12 and 14 at the time of the assaults - have emotional problems and one of them is mentally retarded, according to court papers. Wentz, who lost his job at a bakery

after he was arrested in February,

said he could not give a reason for the assaults. "As much as I have loved children, as many children as I have raised, I couldn't understand why I did something like that

A social services worker testifled that she did not know how many children had lived with the Wentz family over the 17 years he housed youngsters. Wentz said before space requirements were enacted, he once had 23 children in his four-bedroom home in the 2900 block of Ridgefield Drive. Foster parents are paid a stipend for each child based on the child's age.

Two of the girls were molested in December 1983, while the other was assaulted in October 1982. One of the girls told a psychiatrist last December and he reported it to the Social Services Division of the Norfolk Human Resources Department. All the children were removed from the Wentz home after his arrest.

Baker sentenced Wentz to five years on each charge for a total of 15 years, but he suspended 10 years. He

also ordered Wentz to serve consecutive 12-month jail sentences as a condition of the suspended time and placed him on supervised probation for two years after he is released from jail. Wentz, who has no prior criminal record, could be eligible for parole in one year and four months."

Defense lawyer Howard E. Cope-land had said he had "never seen a more guilt-ridden client" than Wentz.

"I'm not impressed that he is and that's because I don't believe he's being completely truthful," Baker responded. While Wentz claimed the girls had enticed him by lifting their dresses and flirting, the girls told ! police that Wentz was the aggressor.

Lenita Ellis, an assistant commonwealth's attorney, asked for a "substantial penitentiary sentence" and suggested a 25-year term. "Threeyoung girls' lives have been inalterably changed," she said. "We can't take that away from them and Mr. Wentz says he is ready to pay the price and he should pay."


