SUBJECT:

Actions taken by Camp Director, Samuel H. Wilkinson, in homosexual investigation of Dennis Helms, Scoutmaster of Troop 120.

Troop 120 is sponsored by the Southport Heights Christian Church, 117 Pine Street, Indianapolis, Indiana 46227.

Pre-investigation information: On Sunday, June 17, 1984, three scouts from Troop 174 came to Camp Ransburg as provisional campers. Following direction from the Council Director of Camping, Jack Zirkle, the three provisional campers: John Matthew Rawley of 1640 North Delaware, Indianapolis; Rob Johnstone of 5141 North Meridian, Indianapolis; and Donald Handfield of 2143 North Delaware, Indianapolis; were assigned to join in with six other troops in the Crows Nest Campsite. These six troops were working together and have had excellent programs during the past several years. The leadership in Crows Nest were willing to take the provisional campers and include them as members of their activities during the week at camp.

On Wednesday night, June 20, the Camp Director, was observing activities in front of the Camp Office when an adult male from Troop 174 came up and said that "he was taking the three boys from Troop 174 home and that he would write a letter to the Council Office telling them why.

The next morning, Thursday June 21, the Camp Director talked to Mr. Dennis Helms about why the boys from Troop 174 went home. Mr. Helms said that they told him that they were going to Troop Leader Development which was going on during the week. The Camp Director also asked the same question of several other adults in the campsite and received the same answer each time.

Awareness of the Problem: On Thursday evening, June 21, Mr. Johnstone (Scoutmaster of Troop 174) called from Washington D.C. and asked why his boys went home. The phone connection was very bad and our Business Manager, Mike Moore, took the call because the Camp Director has a hearing problem. Through a relayed conversation, we told Mr. Johnstone the answers we had received as to why the three boys went home. Mr. Johnstone said that he would get back to us. Sometime later Mr. Johnstone called again and reported that the reason the three boys went home was because they were afraid. The three boys had talked to Scouts from Troop 120 and had been told of somethings that had happened to Scouts in their troop. The information relayed by Mr. Johnstone was that said an incident had occurred at an adult leaders house and that said some adult put his hand inside his swim suit and touched him.

The Camp Director researched to see what Troop and were in. Mr. Dan Winkler, Scoutmaster of Troop 716 and Camp Staff Medical Officer, knew all the boys in the campsite and reported that and (Oldham) were in Troop 120. Being well after midnight the research was stopped until the next morning. Our Program Director, Charles Dobbins, and the Medical Officer, Dan Winkler, were informed of the possible problem.

While the telephone call was being made Mr. Helms told the Camp Director that he would resign from Scouting and sign a statement that the statements of the Scouts were true. Mr. Helms made his statements in writing, papers are on file, and the same was witnessed by Mr. Prichard, Mr. Dobbins and Mr. Samuel Wilkinson, who is the Camp Director.

Mr. Helms was asked to leave camp. He left camp without packing his personal gear. He left at 10:05 P.M. June 21, 1984.

Mr. Dobbins called the parents of the Scouts involved and talked with them.

Sergeant M. L. Allcron, of the Bloomington State Police Post, came sometime after 11:00 P.M. on Friday, June 22, and ran his own investigation.

From the time the Camp found out about a possible problem with some adult to Mr. Helms leaving camp was 24 to 26 hours. The actions taken were to protect the Scouts.

REPORT OF STEPS TAKEN BY PROGRAM DIRECTOR IN CHILD HOLESTING INCIDENT BY DENNIS HELMS

I was advised of the situation on Thursday evening, June 21, 1984, when I walked in on a phone call between Mike Moore and Mr. Johnstone who is the Scoutmaster of Troop 174. Troop 174 had 3 boys in camp during period 2 as provisional scouts. They had been placed in Troop 120 for the week. The boys got scared and left camp after some of the Scouts from Troop 120 told them that they had been molested by their Scoutmaster, Dennis Helms.

On Friday morning a number of boys (10 - 15) complained of feeling ill. We spent part of the morning checking to see if it could have possibly been something that the boys ate. After lunch (1:15 P.M.) Sam and I used the excuse of checking to see what some boys had eaten to talk to 2 of them,

(Both had been mentioned by Mr. Johnstone in his conversation with Mike Moore.) Our conversation with went no where, but in talking to the mentioned that he had been molested by his Scoutmaster, Dennis Helms. He also said that some other boys in the troop had same experience with Mr. Helms. We told him that we would take care of the problem and for him not to tell anyone that he had spoken with us.

At this point, (about 2:00 P.M.) we attempted to talk with Gus Bosio or Don Smith in the Indianapolis office. Neither were available. At 3:00 I left camp for awhile and when I returned around 5:00 P.M. we still had not heard from Gus or Don. At this point we approached Larry Prichard, (a Scoutmaster and a State Police Officer). We asked legal questions about Child Molesting without mentioning the circumstances of persons involved. Sam talked to Gus about 6:30 and he said that Sam was to remove him from Camp.

After supper Sam, myself, and Larry Prichard took into the cooks cabin and got a written signed statement about a molestation incident with Dennis Helms. We then got a similar incident from

At about 8:30 we confronted Dennis. We told him that he had been accused by some of his Scouts of molesting them. He acted shocked and confused. He claimed he was innocent. He was then told that we wanted a signed resignation from the Boy Scouts of America and a signed confession, or we would have to call the police. Dennis said he would not write either. At that point we called the State Police Post in Bloomington. While we were on the phone, Dennis changed his mind and would write both. We typed what he wrote and he signed them. He left camp at 10:05 P.M. on Friday, June 22, 1984.

At about 10:30 I contacted both parents of the boys involved. They both said that they would like to come to camp immediately and could not be discouraged.

At about 11:30 Detective M. L. Allcron from the Indiana State Police Post in Bloomington arrived in camp to start an investigation. Since a felony was committed we had not choice of pressing or not pressing charges.

Soutmaster charged with child molesting

An Indianapolis scoutmaster has been charged with child molesting in connection with two alleged sexual encounters with scouts in his troop during campouts at the Lake Monroe Boy Scout reservation.

Charged was Dennis L. Helms, 38, leader of Indianapolis Boy Scout Troop 120. Helms, who resigned from the troop last Friday, had been scoutmaster for 15 years, according to Monroe County Prosecutor Ron Waicukauski.

WAICUKAUSKI said an arrest warrant was issued for Helms Tuesday after an Indiana State Police investigation into the incidents. He had not been arrested as/of late this morning.

One of the incidents leading to the charges was alleged to have occurred a week ago at the camp during an open swimming session. The incident leading to the second charge occurred in June 1983, Waicukauski said.

Waicukauski said the investigation began when Boy Scout officials contacted state police after receiving reports from some scouts that there were rumors within the troop of unusual incidents involving Helms.

He said the three scouts who reported the rumors had been assigned to the troop on a temporary basis after their own scout leader was unable to accompany them to the camp:

After hearing the rumors within the troop, the scouts departed camp early. Scout officials asked them why they were leaving and they reported the stories they had heard, Waicukauski said.

SCOUT OFFICIALS then notified police, he said.

During a probable cause hearing Tuesday, state police investigators charged that Helms fondled a 12-year-old boy at a beach on the lake last week. They also charged that he fondled an 11-year-old boy during last year's camp session while sharing his tent with the child.

Waicukauski said that when police attempted to serve the warrant on Heims at his Indianapolis home, they were unable to locate him.

The prosecutor said there are no other suspects in the investigation.

The charge involving the 11-year-old is a class C felony, punishable by up to eight years in jail. The charge involving the 12-year-old is a Class D felony, with a penalty of up to four years in jail.

Waicukauski said investigators from the Marion County prosecutor's office and the Marion County sheriff's department are investigating complaints against Helms for similar offenses that are alleged to have occurred in Marion County.

That investigation grew from the Monroe County investigation and follows interviews with several troop members and their families.

Ex-scoutmaster sought on child molest charges

An Indianapolis man, who resigned last week as a Boy Scout-master, is being sought on seven charges of child molesting in incidents involving boys who had been memoers of his troop.

Police in Bloomington and Indianapolis are seeking Dennis L. Heims. 38. formerly of 237 Mason Street, for allegedly molesting boys aged 11 to 13 during a weeking camping trip at Lake Monroe and at other times at his Indianapolis home.

According to an affidavit filed Wednesday in Marion Superior Court. Criminal Division, Room 4, the incidents occurred between October 1983, and this month.

Police were called in Monroe County after a camp director at Ransburg Scout Reservation heard rumors at the campsite that Helms had fondled a Scout who had slept in his tent and another Scout who had gone swimming with him.

After the camp director talked to Helms, police were called, according to A. John Bosio, council executive of Crossroads of America Council, Boy Scouts of America.

Helms resigned his position as scoutmaster last Friday after heading a troop for eight years. Bosio said.

He said Helms became a scoutmaster on the recommendation of a troop committee of Scouts' parents.

The scouting official said there have been only a few problems with volunteers, despite the agency having no means of investigating a volunteer's background.

"I think the vast majority of parents realize that with 12,000 adult volunteers, we're going to have some problems, he said."

Helms. who recently quit a job as an ambulance dispatcher and moved from his home, was charged by Monroe County officials with three counts of child molesting, said Monroe County Prosecutor Ron Waicukauski.

During questioning of some of the boys, officials learned that other incidents had taken place in Indianapolis. Helms was charged here with four counts of child molesting.

Three boys told police that in October 1983, while spending the night at Helms' home. Helms "insisted" that one of them sleep with him.

To determine which boy would sleep with him. Helms told all three of the boys to draw a card and the boy who drew the lowest card would sleep in his bed.

The boy with the lowest card reported that while in bed. Heims fondled him to ejaculation.

"The following morning the boys discussed the incident and (the boy who slept with Helms) said he never wanted to sleep with Mr. Helms again," the affidavit stated.


In another incident that occurred on June 6, a 12-year-old boy told police that while he was at Helms' home working on his Environmental Skill Award, Heims told him to go into his (Helms') bedroom because he wanted to "show him something."

The boy was ordered to remove his ciothes at which time Helms allegedly performed oral sex on him, the affidavit stated.

Other boys related similar incidents in which Helms fondled them or asked them to remove their clothing.

In another incident, the boys were told to take off one article of clothing each time they missed the target in a game of darts.

During the early morning hours of Friday, June 22, several boys and adult in the camp reported to the health lodge sick. After breakfast the Camp Director investigated possible causes of the nausea. The Director told Mr. Winkler to schedule appointments with Scouts who had been ill and Scouts who had not been ill so to see if any item of food was common to those sick and not to those well. Mr. Winkler was told to be sure that were among those to be interviewed. Charles Dobbins was told of these arrangements and the plans to interview and also about anything an adult may have done to them. The interviews were set up this way to protect the two boys in case there really was a problem.

Mr. Dobbins and the Camp Director interviewed fourteen Scouts after lunch on Friday, June 22. In direct questions out to in private he said that he had no problems. In his session, was asked if any adult had done anything to him this week that he should have not done and he replied that Mr. Helms had put his hand in his swim trunks while at the waterfront and played with his privates. It also indicated that the had also had some problems with Mr. Helms.

After this information was gathered, Mr. Dobbins and the Camp Director talked about what actions to take.

Action taken: Friday afternoon a call was placed to the Council Office in an attempt to talk to the administrative heads of the Council. Both Mr. Bosio and Mr. Smith, Scout Executive and Director of Field Service, were out of the office. Mr. Smith was expected back in the office by 4 P.M. While waiting for a call back from the Council Office, the Camp Director was told that Larry Prichard, Scoutmaster of Troop 7 which was in Camp, was a State Policeman. The Camp Director went to Mr. Prichard, and without naming any names, asked what were the laws on homosexuals. No direct information was given to Mr. Prichard at this time.

Shortly after 5:00 P.M. on Friday, June 22, we found that Mr. Bosio, Scout Executive, was on his way from Camp Redwing to Camp Bear Creek near Connersville, Indiana. Mr. Dobbins called Camp Bear Creek and asked them to have Mr. Bosio call us as soon as possible.

About 6:15 P.M. Mr. Bosio called and was told of the problem. Following the directions given by Mr. Bosio the three Scouts were called in to get written statements. Larry Prichard, Charles Dobbins, and the Camp Director conducted the statement sessions.

made written statements of incidents with Mr. Helms. Statements are on file.

Again, following the directions of Mr. Bosio, Mr. Helms was brought up from his campsite by Mr. Prichard, Mr. Dobbins and the Camp Director. He was confronted with the statements and Mr. Helms said that the statements were not true. Mr. Prichard said that in that case we had no choice but to call the State Police and went to the office to call the Police in Bloomington.
