Dear Mr. Ernst:

I received a call from Earl L. Brandy, Scout Executive of Michigan City, at my office stating they had an applicant by the name of Mark Thoms Short who was interested in professional Scouting. This applicant had been a member of the State Highway Patrol and Mr. Brandy had received an unfavorable reply to a reference letter sent to the State Highway Patrol. Earl also stated he had called them and they refused to talk to him over the phone about this man. He therefore asked if we could make a contact as he wanted to give Mr. Short an answer that afternoon.

All this information was given to my secretary, Mrs. Soroko. She called me out of a staff meeting to tell me about it, with the result I called the State Highway Patrol, identified myself, explained more in detail what was going on, and the only answer I received was  $^{\prime\prime}$  Mr. Short had been dismissed from the State Highway Patrol and that there was a moral issue involved. The man I talked to had boys in Scouting and said he would not want Mr. Short active with his boys." He would not give us any kind of written statement. He said the results which ended in dismissal were confidential and this was all he would say.

I then called Earl and reported my conversation. Earl evidently decided he had better not hire the man.

I do not have any more information than that stated above and the Highway Patrol will not give us any written statement.

Dear Ebert:

Mark Thomas Short, whose application we processed to the point of approval and use, should have his name in our confidential file. Just prior to having him sign a contract, the Scout Executive at Michigan City, Indiana, Earl Brandt, was informed by the Indiana State Police that Short should not be employed. In a confrontation with him, Brandt says that Short stated that he did commit improper approaches to individuals "while intoxicated."

He was not on the council payroll. We expect no further problem. He was checked out with local State Police in Elkhart by Scout Executive Graham Howard prior to his application being approved. Frank Chase, Scout Executive at Indianapolis, was good enough to check it out with the authorities in the State House in Indianapolis because they would not put it in writing or talk over the telephone.
