CAMP MANATOC

Tuesday morning, July 25, staff-in-training reported to the Reservation Director that he had been sexually accosted Sunday eve (or early Monday morning) in Bittersweet cabin during his sleep. He awoke to find someone feeling him inside his underwear. He identified this someone as Thomas Anderson-the camp steward. Noone else was a witness to the incident.

Tuesday evening with the Assistant Camp Director and Chaplain-Tom Anderson was confronted with the report that he had been involved in the incident with the confronted on the day mentioned. He in turn admitted:

- 1. He did commit the act described.
- 2. He was fully awake and did know that he was doing the act.
- 3. He did not aim to hurt anyone.
- 4. He has never been involved with any campers.
- 5. He realizes that he has a problem and is now relieved that he has been caught and the problem can be recognized. His parents will be notified.

Both the Reservation Director and the Assistant Camp Director emphasized the need for professional counseling.

It was the decision of the Reservation Director that Tom Anderson be released from his job and return home-as of 7-26-72. His remaining would be detrimental to staff morale. Every effort to conceal the true reason for his leaving would be made. Those involved in the incident would be briefed to the point that all the above happening was confidental and discussion of it with other people would be harmful to all.
