The article, which appeared in the PHILADELPHIA INQUIRER on August 22, 1987, reports that Gibson was convicted in U. S. District Court in Philadelphia in February 1987 of using minors to produce sexually explicit material and transporting that material across state lines. He subsequently was charged by a Bucks County grand jury with eight counts of corruption of minors, five counts of indecent assault, and three counts each of sexual abuse of children, conspiracy, and endangering the welfare of children.

Grand jury accuses 2 Bucks men of sexually molesting seven boys

Two Bucks County men were accused by a county grand jury yesterday of sexually abusing seven boys over the last three years, ranging from taking nude photographs to bondage.

The two men, an engineer and a former vice president of a Bucks County industrial instrument company, befriended the boys and then photographed and molested them, according to the grand jury presentment. The boys were between 9 and

14 years old, the presentment said: The men, Paul C. Waser, 49, of Upper Southampton, and Gerald W. Gibson, 45, of Morrisville, are in a federal penitentiary. They were con-victed in February of interstate. transport of child pornography.

U.S. Customs agents began investigating the two men last year after. intercepting four rolls of film that

they allegedly mailed to Florida for processing. The photographs, taken during a West Virginia camping trip. included sexually explicit pictures of of corruption of minors, five counts a 9-year-old Bensalem boy, said Special Agent William J. Shields.

A subsequent search of the men's. homes uncovered thousands of. slides depicting nudity; bondage, sadomasochism and explicit sexual acts as well as pornographic books videos, handcuffs, leather manacles and literature from a man-boy love association, Shields said.

The federal investigation led to a five-month county grand jury investigation.

The grand jury recommended that: Waser, a former vice president of Princo Instruments Inc. in Southampton, be charged with four counts. of sexual abuse of children and threecounts each of conspiracy, corruption of minors and endangering the welfare of children.

It also recommended that Gibson, a former engineer with the same company, be charged with eight counts of indecent assault and three counts each of sexual abuse of children. conspiracy and endangering the welfare of children.

in February, Waser and Gibson were convicted in U.S. District Court in Philadelphia of using minors to produce sexually explicit material and transporting that material across state lines, both violations of the federal Child Protection Act, according to Shields.

Waser pleaded guilty to a second charge of producing illegal material photographs showing a naked boy restrained by leather manacles on his ankles and wrists. He was sen tenced to 18 months in jail. Gibsor received a one-year sentence. Both are in a federal correctional facility in Danbury, Conn.

There are no newspaper clippings of any kind as this did not make the local papers. Nevertheless, it has been clearly established that Mr. Gibson did, in fact, practice deviant sexual behavior with boys - he did, in fact, admit to this aberrant behavior to the committee, to me, and to the police department. Conversations with boys corroborated the same information, and Mr. Gibson has agreed to undergo some psychiatric help with respect to overcoming this problem.

The facts, therefore, indicate the necessity for this action.
