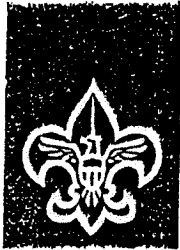

Louis F. Bessert, 33, Mosinee Route 1, who is charged with two counts of non-marital intercourse with a relative and one count of attempted non-marital intercourse with a relative, had his case adjourned to July 5.

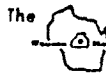
