Frederick Leonard Sundling

Was formerly registered in Boy Scouting and Exploring. Has twice been convicted and has served time in prison for child abuse. Upon his release, each time he has sought out associations with youth organizations.

Confidential information from Chief of Police, Jim Douglas, Saline, Michigan (313/429-7911) or detective assigned to the case, Detective Sargent Bob Dietrich.

Sundling recently purchased 4 red Scout jackets from a Scouting distributor and has been seen to have 7 to 10 boys at his swimming pool in his back yard in Saline, Michigan.

We suspect he may be using Scouting as a pretense to attract youth saying, "We plan to organize a troop or post." He is on our confidential list in Dallas and is not currently registered according to our confidential records. We need to be alert that he may attempt to use Scouting in this manner, most likely in the Wolverine Council in Saline or in the Marquette, Michigan councils in Escanaba, Michigan.

His last conviction was in 1982. He is a white male, born 8/3/24. His known address is 622 Rosemont, Saline, Michigan. His driver's license number is SM534 261 507 608.



Sex Charge Brings 1925/77 Plea Of No Contest

Frederick L. Sundling, 53, pleaded noto contendere (no contest) Monday to two charges of criminal sexual conduct involving boys.

Sundling, who lives at 622 Rosemont St., Saline, will be sentenced by Circuit Judge Patrick J. Conlin Dec. 15.

One of the charges against Sundling involved a 15-year-old boy and the oth-

er a 12-year-old boy.

Judge Conlin said he was accepting the no contest plea for the sake of the boys who otherwise would have to testify in court. He said he would not allow the plea to be withdrawn at a later date.


Washtenaw County Prosecutor William F. Delhey and Donald Kenney, Sundling's attorney, said the plea was made under agreement that the prosecutor would not file additional charges resulting from the investigation of the two cases.

Kenney told the court Sundling would enter a psychiatric hospital to-day for at least 45 days of treatment. He said psychiatric therapy for Sundling has been going on since last spring.

In another criminal sexual conduct case. Johnnie Griggs, 50, of 8745 Crane Rd., Pittsfield Township, pleaded no contest to two charges involving one girl and two boys, aged 6, 7 and 9. The activities allegedly took place last May and June in a barn on Griggs' Crane Road property.

Griggs is to be sentenced by Circuit Judge Ross W. Campbell Dec. 9.

Griggs could be sentenced to up to life in prison, while Sundling could receive up to 15 years in prison.



Former Scout Leader Gets Prison Term

A former Boy Scout leader from Saline was sentenced to prison this morning for two sex offenses.


Fred Sundling, 53, was arrested last summer on charges that he performed sexual acts with teenagers he had been counseling in a Boy Scout unit.

Sundling pleaded nolo contendre (no contest) on Oct. 24 to charges of gross indecency and criminal sexual conduct, second degree.

Circuit Court Judge Patrick J. Conlin this morning sentenced Sundling to three years and four months to five years in prison on the gross indecency charge. A sentence of five to 15 years was given on the criminal sexual conduct count. The two terms are to run concurrently.

Sundling told the judge that he was "extremely grateful" to the court for accepting the no contest pleas earlier.

"I have received a great number of letters on your behalf and I'm impressed by them," Judge Conlin told Sundling. "I'm impressed with your counseling but not with what you did."

Ex-Scout Executive Arraigned

A former Boy Scout executive, at one time in charge of 17 Washtenaw County troops with over 500 members, has been charged with two counts involving criminal sexual conduct.

Frederick L. Sundling, 52, of Saline, is currently free on a \$25,000 bond on one of the charges, gross indecency with a 15-year-old boy. A second warrant charging Sundling with criminal sexual conduct, second degree, also has been obtained. That count involves a 12-year-old boy, authorities, say.

Prosecuting Attorney William F. Delhey said the charges were brought against Sundling after a search warrant was obtained for his home at 622 Rosemont St. in Saline. Officers from the Saline Police Department searched the residence and, Delhey says, found numerous photographs showing homosexual activity and literature dealing with homosexual interests.

DELHEY SAID the investigation has unearthed a "wide-ranging" series of homosexual activities involving Sundling. And the prosecutor said on the basis of present evidence his office could charge Sundling with "30 or 40" criminal sexual counts involving teen-age boys.

"Many, but not all of the victims, were Boy Scouts at the time of the crimes and Sundling used his position as a Scout leader to entice the boys," the prosecutor said.

Delhey said the two cases now pending involve incidents which occurred at Sundling's home. Other incidents. Delhey added, are known to have occurred at Sundling's office at St. Joseph Mercy Hospital where he is employed as a substance abuse therapist. Delhey said.

IN 1961, SUNDLING came to Washtenaw County from the Upper Peninsula where he had served as assistant Boy Scout executive of the Hlawathaland Council in Marquette. He wasnamed district Scout executive here for six county communities. They included Dexter, Chelsea, Manchester, Milan, Saline and Whitmore Lake.

In July, 1969, Sundling pleaded guilty in Circuit Court here to a charge of taking indecent libertles with a minor child. Three months later he was placed on five years probation and ordered to pay a fine of \$100 and court costs of \$200. A 30-day County Jail term was suspended on condition he continue medical treatment.

At the time of that conviction, Sundling was still a Scout executive, authorities said. Investigators say he has continued to work with the Boy Scout organization on a part-time basis although he no longer is a paid executive.

SUNDLING WAS arraigned Monday on the gross indecency charge before 14th District Court Judge Henry Arkison who set an examination date for May 19. The judge ordered the suspect to jail on a \$25,000 bond. He was released the following day when a bonding company posted the bond.

The second charge of criminal sexual conduct, second degree, was authorized by Delhey on Thursday. However. Sundling is not expected to be arraigned on that charge until he returns from northern Michigan on Monday. At that time he is scheduled to surrender himself to local authorities while accompanied by his attorney.

Sundling, married and the father of three children, has lived in Saline since being appointed district Scout executive in 1961. The Scout district to which he was assigned was a newlycreated unit and one of four under the Portage Trails Boy Scout Council.
