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

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

Brief AIW Strike Settled

Members of Allied Industrial Workers Local 922 undinously ratified a two-year contract Friday with Ornamental Metalworks Co.

The union members went on strike Wednesday, return to work Monday.

Local 922 President Charles O. Huff said union and company representatives met Friday morning and reached a tentative agreement. The membership then ratified the contract which calls for wage increases of four per cent the first year and three per cent the second.

The contract also calls for an extra holiday, an improved pension plan and the company paying a larger share of dependent insurance. Huff said.

The union's contract covers 22 members but half are on lavolf, he said.
