Police nab 3 in scoul sex ring

NEW ORLEANS (AP) — A Boy Scout troop's scoutmaster and assistant scoutmaster were arrested yesterday and accused of recruiting boys for homosextual orgies.

Detective Gus Stansbury of the police juvenile bureau said three men were accested. Three others, including another ascistant scoutagaster for the same troop, were being sought.

Stansbury and Detective Frank Weighs continued continued from the first of names and addresses of boys in other states, apparently based on hoy-to-boy "pen pal" contacts the men made through pornographic magazines.

In addition, officers solved bemenuck snapshots of sex orgres. Officers said the investigation started when a commercial film developer called them about a pornographic film involving boys.

Stacks of the magazines, confiscated at men's horses, bore such titles as, "Young Boys and Oral Sex," "Naked Boyhood," and "Boys For Sale."

Stansbury said the investigation was incomplete but that only "some" of Troop 137's 21 boys, aged 11 and 12, were involved in sexual parties with the men.

About 15 boys are shown in the photographs, but not all were members of the troop, Stansbury said.

He identified the men arrested as the scootmaster, Richard Halvorsen, 51; an assistant scootmaster, Ray T. Woodall Jr., 49; and Lloyd R. Schwegmenn, 29.

A spokesman at the national headquarters of the Boy Scouts in New Brunswick, N.J., when told of the arrests, said the organization would have no comment "at this point until we have a chance to look into the matter."



Charges Against 17 in Scout Sex Case

Seventeen men, one a Boston millionaire, have been charged in a widening investigation of the use of a Boy Scout troop here to supply boys for homosexual sex.

"It has been like dropping a pebble into water," said Dist. Atty. Harry Connick. "You think you've got it all but the ripple ring keeps spreading."

The men were all charged with sex acts with boys from 8 to 15 years old over a two-year period ending last September. Not all of the Scouts in the now defunct troop were involved.

"We find some of the men have also been active in other parts of the country," Connick added. "Some have been prosecuted in England and the Philippines for sex involving children."

The first of the series of trials was scheduled in Criminal District Court Tuesday but a lawyer for Raymond T. Woodall, 38, of New Orleans, asked for a delay. He said Woodall had been committed to a state mental hospital due to severe dépression and suicidal tendencies.

Woodail, assistant Scout master of Boy Scout Troop 137, was charged with 13 counts of "unnatural carnal knowledge."

The most numerous charges were filed against Richard C. Jacobs, a millionaire who lived at Arlington, a Boston suburb, and against Richard Halvorsen, who was troop Scout master.

Jacobs, whose trial is scheduled May 10, surrendered himself with two lawyers at his side here April 4 to be arraigned on 15 counts of "aggravated crime against nature," which carries a maximum penalty of 15 years per count.

Connick declined to spell out how the investigation led to Jacobs, or how five other men from distant sections of the nation allegedly turned up in New Orleans to join the proceedings.

"Obviously there was some kind of communications or network involved," he said.

It all started with a police raid last September on the residence of Halvorsen, 51, a man who liked to keep unusual information in neat, orderly files. He atands charged on 16 counts of aggravated crime against nature.

The raid developed when some film of men-boy sex was sent to a commercial developer — who called the police when he saw the resulting photographs.

Among other things, officers said they found a file cabinet with a lot of names and addresses, even photographs, involving other homosexuals some as far away as Saudi Arabia.

Copies of film, names and addresses, distributed to other police departments, led to other raids. One unusual arrest stemming from the files was that of an Episcopal priest at Winchester, Tenn., the Rev. Claudius Ira Vermilye Jr., 47, who operated a home for wayward boys.

The priest, whose trial is pending, was indicted on charges of crime against nature and production of homosexual pornographic film at his Boys Farm Inc.
