

The defendant David A. Smith, 32, of 28 Barnstable St., was adjudged guilty by Judge Joseph S. Mitchell, Jr., after a jury waived trial, prosecuted by assistant district attorney Bruce P. Gilmore.

Judge Mitchell then conlinued the case to Oct. 29 for sentencing, and ordered paychiatric consultation for Smith so that the data would be available for the court's evaluation in sentencing.
