## Follow-up Probe of Jones' Death Continues

Whe the John Doc-Robert Jones vestigation has been officially osed by Circuit Judge William ramling, District Attorney Richard cConnell said today follow-up instigating still is being conducted.

He and Sheriff Edward O'Connor we agreed Sheriff's Department tectives will continue to "search or new leads into new areas," Meonnell said.

The investigation is a result of the nicide of Robert M. Jones, former 'aukesha Memorial Hospital presient, after a bachlor party at his many by 5. Five friends of Jones are been charged with morals of mses involving young boys.

McConnell revealed he and 'Connor's men are looking into a port that a suicide last year may e connected with the group of lleged homosexuals.

The man was Rome B. Taft, 44, associate director of food services at aukesha Memorial Hospital. He hot himself in the head in a Milaukee motel Aug. 23. He had been ought by Waukesha police for fleged indecent behavior with a 14-ear-old boy.

McConnell said today he was asked by a 'woman' 'to check for ny connection a Taft's death and the Jones incidents.

and any alleged sexual misconduct on his part and the Jones matter. However, I am going to look into it for my own edification and possibly have some follow-up investigation done."

His response to the woman's request appeared to be in line with his invitation, in the press, for anyone with factual information concerning the Jones-Doe probe to contact him or the Sheriff's Department.

"I am concerned about rumors and innuendoes," he said. "Waukesha doesn't need a black eye. We had one Frame Park incident years ago, and I think Waukesha has lived that down.

"I think it's very irresponsible for people to be spreading rumors where they have no basis in fact.

"I certainly intend to be vigilant, and the sheriff will do likewise.

"It doesn't do the community any good to be spreading rumors about a 'ring of homosexuals.' I know of none that exists."

Regarding specifies of the John Doe investigation, McConnell, in answer to questions this morning, revealed that one of the boys alleged to have been involved was promised a car, a motorcycle and a minibike by one of the men, but never received them, although he had the use of them while he lived with the man.

They're the only things given or offered to any of the boys involved, he said.

A 13-year old girl who McConnell earlier had said was "imported" by Jones during a campout of Boy Scouts at his country home May 17-19 was a sister of thre three brothers, McConnell disclosed.

The girl "went skinny-dipping" with the scouts in Jones' pool the night of May 17, McConnell had said earlier.

The spelling of the last name of the fifth man taken into court was incorrect on the criminal complaint, McConnellalso said today.

The man is Mark P. Podratz, 32, of N30-W26526 Peterson Drive, the same address as Slater's. The spelling the complaint was "Poder out McConnell said it will be corrected today."

WAUKESHA, Wis. — Five men, including two Boy Scour leaders, have been arrested on morals charges for alleged attacks on a large number of young boys.

Waukesha District Atty.

Waukesha District Atty. Richard McConnell said the arrests stemmed from an investigation of the suicide of a prominent Waukesha hospital administrator after a May scouting campout at his rural Genesee home.

McConnell said a total of 61 charges were filed against the five men.

He said most of the alleged attacks took place at the bachelor home of Robert M. Jones, 49. a hospital administrator who died of carbon monoxide poisoning July 5, the day after a party at his home involving about 30 men and boys.

AN INVESTIGATION of the death, which authorities ruled was a suicide, led to the five arrests Tuesday.

The charges against the men included a variety of felonies and misdemeanors, including exhibiting obscene films to children, sexual perversion and taking indecent liberties with a child.

The boys involved ranged from 10 to 15 years old, McConnell said.

Some of the alleged attacks took place at a Boy Scout

campout at the home of Jones, a bachelor, May 17 to 19, McConnell said.

Those arrested were Jack Keating, 32, a Scout troop leader, of Genesee; and four Pewaukee men: Patrick Prudlow, 29, an assistant Scout troop leader; Fred Fohey, 32; Dean Slater, 35, and Mark Podcrats, 23.

McConnell cleared the hospital and the Boy Scout organization of any blame for the behavior of the men. And he said none of the juveniles will be taken into court except to be referred to Juvenile Court and Social Services Department for psychiatric treatment as a result of what the adults did to them.

All of the cases called this morning were adjourned to allow lawyers to file motions, County Judge William Callow continued the bail amounts set earlier by Circuit Court Judge William G. Gramling. They range from \$5,000 to \$15,000.

Three brothers aged 10, 14 and 15were there, and spent part of the. time tending bar. McConnell explained today Jones, argued with Prudlow and Slater, about them taking the 10-year-old and 15-year-old to their respective homes.

There was no criminal activity at the Jones party that night, McConnell said, but Jones "became very upset" when he learned the boys wanted to leave. '..

That's when he cleared the house of all guests after threatening to kill himself. His body was found the next day in his car in his garage. The coroner ruled it suicide by carbon monoxide poisoning.

At a press conference after the court session, McConnell went through the cases one by one. He said that, at his request, Judge Gramling had closed the Doe probe about 4 p.m. Monday after four morewitnesses were quizzed.

The DA stressed, however, that if anyone has information about law violations "by living persons," his office or the sheriff's office should be contacted.

A total of 25 persons were questioned in four sessions, including one held Saturday - without notice to the press, he said."All those questioned Saturday are juveniles, he explained. The Saturday session was held to accommodate family vacation schedules, he said.

His offenses are indecent acts with a boy, the DA claims. He also furnished brandy and sour for a 16-yearold boy he took to Fohey's house for film-showing homosexual activities, McConnell charges.
