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





The purpose of this letter is to put to rest the unresolved allegations on record for James Hogan. Mr. Hogan is a member of the Portland First Ward in the Portland Oregon Stake of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints. Having discussed this matter thoroughly with Bishop Willis Packham of the First Ward, and President Herb Hill who is our Stake President, I am completely satisfied that the accusations on record are completely without substance.

The matter was reviewed thoroughly by the ecclesiastical authorities at the time of the complaint and again just recently in connection with recent callings extended to Mr. Hogan. In essence, Jim has a great love for young people and occasionally demonstrates this feeling with an embrace or otherphysical contact. He has been counselled to be careful as this action has the potential of being misinterpreted in spite of its total innocence.

I hope that this will be sufficient to clear his record and allow him to serve in the scouting organization. If I can be of further halp don't hasitate to contact me.



Mr. Hogen was dropped off the charter as of March, 1974 for the following reasons. In the evening of March 15 I was acked to meet with some of the parents of Pack 405 to discuss with them the actions of the former Cubracter, Mr. Hogen.

As it turned out only and and coro represented at the meeting, however, they did give me the manual and phone numbers of many other interested parents which are also enclosed with this document.

In the month of January, 1974 Mr. Hogen took his Webelos den up to the Woodland, Wachington area to see Chief Lelcoska. When he went to pick up the boys at their respective homes he asked some of the parents if it would be alright if their sone stayed over at his house that night as they would probably be returning very late. The at first said no, but then decided it would be okay if Mr. Hogen would please call them as soon as they returned so they would know that their son as well as the other boys had returned safely. They waited up until almost 2:00 A.H. in the morning and heard mothing from Mr. Hogen until the late morning.

When the course come home he told his parents of the following incidence which had occurred the night before in the Eegen house. Mr. Hogan had asked the young man to sleep on the couch in the living room, in his eleming beg which the boy did. In the middle of the night Mr. Hogan cans downstairs and layed on the couch with the young boy

He proceeded to him and kies the boy as well as he ran his arm and his albem down into the boy's crotch, however his arm was cutoids of the sleeping bag. He continued to do this for quite some time. He then left and went back upstairs to his own room -- or at least the boy thought so.

Again in the morning Mr. Hogam came downstairs and did the same thing again. The boy tried to protend that he was not anake by closing his eyes and hiding his head in his sleeping bag, but Mr. Hogam continued the endoavors anyway.

At the Webelos dem meeting the boys according to the all say that Mr. Hogan has been seen many times kissing and hugging the young men behind doors or behind other fixtures within the room. He is constantly picking the boys up by their crotch. One day Mr. Hogan was even by the local mailman hugging and kissing a boy by the name of outside his bone. The boy was taken to Kaiser Clinic to discuss the problem with a Dr. Foreman. Dr. Foreman was unable to get the boy to discuss emything that had happened with Mr. Hogan. The only thing that amybody really knows is that when the boy sees Mr. Hogan he runs and hides. Was a very enthusiastic Cub Scout. One day he came home from a meeting, took off his uniform and threat it and his books into the closet and has not taken them out to this day. According to all who know the young men he is a very outgoing and well-rounded boy, but he is extremely scared of Mr. Hogan to the great concern of the paramets.

There have been many more incidences of the same nature with other boys but as I said at the beginning of this letter the parents were not able to be at our meeting. They also told no that come years ago the Hogen family had a fester sen and that the welfare department took the boy analyfoccuse of this same type of action. There seems to be some questions about the exact amount and where the pack monies have gone. It is thought to be around \$75.00. It was said that Mr. Hogen would buy presents and goodies for the boys who he liked the best in the pack. This bethered many of the parents, however, this was not one of their greatest concerns. The greatest concern was to get help for Mr. Hogen and to keep him out of their neighborhood and aray from their school and cub pack.

As I said in the beginning Mr. Hogen has been dropped from Pack 406, but he is very active with Pack 812 which is in Tyee District - 12th Ward of the Portland State, LDS Church. It was asked by the pack committee if the LDS Church could help Mr. Hogen. When the men went back to Mr. Hogen and asked him if the Bishop had had the opportunity of discussing Mr. Hogen's problem with him, Mr. Hogen simply said yes. The Bishop said not to werry about it at all.

I do not have the names of the individuals involved in that particular conversation. They also told me that about five years ago in. Eggan mas involved in Pack 405 of that same area and that the same problem had occured at that time and he was asked by that committee if he would please withdraw from Scouting, which he did. They called the Scout office and nothing was done to make sure that he could not be registered again.

I have no idea who they talked to - neigher did the people that were represented at the meeting. The other names and phone numbers of people who would be more than willing to make a statement regarding in. Hogan and their some are enclosed.
