Notes from conversation with Mrs. Marion Allied Agency Mental Health Clinic



As you know David Gillman was registered as Scoutmaster of the Salvation Army Troop. After a short
while there he was apprehended with some very questionable homosexual activities. We then discussed the problem with Captain of the Salvation Army, who
of course, immediately eliminated him as the Scoutmaster.
We also struck him from our rolls as well as those of
National Council. However at this point we wonder
whether there is any further that needs to be done about
this young man. My discussion with Mrs.

was
based on a desire fo find out her best advise on this
matter. Her advise ran along these lines:

- 1. David is a chronically disturbed man and has had homosexual tendencies for some time. As long as he is kept away from groups of boys he seemed to be able to withhold his desire. Once with them they do come out. We must not, of course, aldow him to be a Scout Leader in any way.
- She felt that if he was prosecuted and sentenced the sentence would not be a long one, this falling under misdemeanor category and that in a few months he would be back out, doing much the same. She didnot feel that therapy would have anything to do with changing him. She also felt that any time spent in prison would tend to enhance his tendancy in that direction, therefore there is no way that prison could help him. She emphasized the thought that the best experience she has had was that a. counseling with boys who had been involved with this was quite important and that it be done very quietly and with as little fanfare as possible. The bigger the deal made out of this the worse or heavier the impact on the boys and with a possibility that they would practice it even more so because of the relative importance of the situation.

3. On this basis therefore we would conclude David would continue under mental health surveillance and would we keep him away from groups and that we would make this known whenever the occasion arose but that we would not prefer charges at this time.

4. When a member dies (please include his last address When a boy or an adult pays a registration fee, he is a titled to membership until the expiration date indicated on membership certificate.

Separation notices must <u>not</u> be sent to the national office the time of reregistration or for unreregistered units.

For a boy transferring to a new unit, submit an additional enrollment to add him to his new unit. This separation not only separates him from his previous unit, it does not add him to his new unit.

My dear Mr. Roberts:

Misconduct; case of Scoutmaster David Lee Gilman

I want to recapitulate matters in this case to date and then relate the allegations against Mr. Gilman.

After a recent campout two of our boys said they would not again camp out with our Troop. One boy was questioned by his father and related that a second boy had been homosexually molested by Mr. Gilman. The father called me and then contacted the other father.

I interviewed both fathers and the first boy. The second father agreed to talk to his son and get back to me. He did both. I then talked to the second boy who confirmed these facts.

He stated specifically that Mr. Gilman "tried to feel me between my legs" and had touched his penis and testicles. This happened three times the morning of Saturday, March 16, 1974, at Camp Waconda.

The father and son are willing to do what is necessary to prosecute. Our Troop Committee feels that others should be protected and request that Mr. Gilman be restrained from participation in Boy Scout of
