#### 11. Personal Background

Age - 38 - 4/3/74 Wears glasses. Former Employer KORNS IGA - Manager Social Security No. Now on full disability due to operation on back. Married with two children - boy and girl. Was cook in Navy.

## 111. Reason for Placing on File - child molesting

Case Description - On Thursday, August 22, 1974, 1 received a call from our Camp Ranger, Robert Lindner, that the Sheriff of Ontario County desired to talk to a man fitting the description of our cook. Later that evening I received another call - he (Cleveland) had been arrested, pleaded guilty to harrassment, fined \$50.00 and told to leave the Town of Phelps.

I talked to Deputy Sheriff McCabe on August 27, 1974 and received the following verbal report. I was invited to talk to the Justice of the Peace in Phelps but did not feel this was necessary.

Following our Scout camping season, during which Bud Cleveland served for the first time as our Camp cook and I might add did a commendable job, he requested to stay at Camp with his children for the next ten days to fish and relax. His wife works full time in Holley and did come to Camp most weekends. He was to cook at our Cub-Dad Weekend on August 23-25th.

It appears a thirteen year old neighbor girl, named her two brothers and a friend were catching frogs on the edge of our lake. Cleveland invited them to the large pennisula where there were larger frogs. In so-called kidding with this group, he said he was going to wrestle with the girl. He put his arm around her and said some obscene things to her. She broke away and ran home.

Deputy a veteran of the Sheriff's Department, interviewed the crying girl and substantiated the story with the other children. He indicated Cleveland fitted the description of a man the Rochester police were looking for and for the same reason.

Cleveland called me on August 22th and talked with me about his being charged giving me a different story. Following my discussion with the deputy I called Cleveland back indicating because he had pleaded guilty, was arrested and fined I was required to ask him to send in his registration card. He agreed without any hesitation. I have not received this yet.

Cleveland talked with my field man indicating he's going to file a law suit for deformation of character against the family and our Ranger. He did turn over to him his Scouting materials.

The deputy tells me this type individual is called a "woodchuck". Big talk but when challenged runs to his hole. I also talked to the Orleans County Sheriff whom I know and where Cleveland resides.

The opinion of Deputy and the Justice of the Peace is - he has an emotional problem and needs psychiatric help.

We just cannot gamble.
