sts 65 years for sex crimes

A former Eugene Cub Scout leader, convicted of committing eight sex crimes involving four boys in his pack, has been sentenced to 65 years in preson.

Jerrold-Steven-Flemming 38 was sentenced Friday morning by Eane County Circuit Judge James Hargreaves on six counts of first-degree sodomy and on two counts of first-degree sexual abuse. He was convicted of the charges in a June jury triat.

Flemming was charged with committing the sex crimes against boys ages 7, 9, 10 and 11 years old between June 1, 1979, and July 24, 1980. Flemming was cubmaster of a pack from the Whiteaker Elementary School area for about two months in the spring of 1980.

Hargreaves meted maximum fiveyear sentences on each sexual abuse charge and maximum 20-year sentences on each sodomy count, but ordered that some sentences were to be served concurrently. The judge ordered Flemming , to serve a minimum of 30 years in pris-

In related court action, Flemming's attorney, Terry Gough of Eugene, filed a motion Friday for a retrial of the case. Gough cited irregular jury proceedings and jury misconduct, which "prevented the defendant from having a fair trial," as reasons for a retrial.

New trial denied in case involving ex-Scout leader

A former Eugene Cub Scout leader convicted of committing eight sex crimes involving four boys in his pack has lost his bid for a new trial.

Lane County Circuit Judge James Hargreaves denied a motion Wednesday for a new trial in the case of Jerroid Steven Flemming, 38, who was convicted June 23 of six counts of first-degree sodomy and of two counts of first-degree sexual abuse. The charges stemmed from sex crimes committed against boys ages 7, 9, 10 and 11 years old between June 1, 1979, and July 24, 1980.

Flemming's attorney argued Wednesday that Flemming didn't have a fair trial in June because of irregular jury proceedings and jury misconduct.

Eartier this month, Hargreaves sentenced Flemming to 65 years in prison, and ordered him to serve a minimum of 30 years. Flemming was cubmaster of a pack from the Whiteaker Elementary School area for about two months in the spring of 1989.

Jury convicts former Cub Scout leader of sex crimes

A J8-year-old Eugene man who served as a Cub Scout leader for two months in 1980 has been found-guilty ofcommitting eight sex crimes involving. four boys in his back.

The nineman, three-woman jury found Jerrold Steven Flemming guilty of six counts of first-degree sodomy and of two counts of first-degree sexual abuse after deliberating for about 314 hours Tuesday evening. The trial before Lane County Circuit Judge James Hargreaves began last week and lasted about three days.

Flemming was charged with committing sex crimes against boys ages 7, 9, 10 and 11 years old between June 1, 1979 and July 24, 1980, according to indictments filed against Flemming, Flemmiing was cubmaster of a pack from the Whiteaker Elementary School area for about two months in the spring of 1980.

Flemming's attorney. Terry Gough of Eugene, had sought to convince the jury that Flemming should not be held responsible for his actions because he was - and is - so mentally ill that he couldn't conform to the law. Flemming, who did not take the stand, did not deny any of the charges against him.

But Deputy District Attorney Robert Gorham, who prosecuted the case, characterized Flemming as "a basic child molester" who knew very well that what he was doing was wrong

"If he didn't know it was wrong, why didn't he do it on a football fleid or somewhere where he could've got caught?" Gorham asked the jury. "Why did he tell the kids not to tell anyone or they'll get into trouble? Certainly he knew this was a crime. He tried to hide it from people."

Gorham told the jurors that children have rights and deserved to be protected "from people like this."

"Think about the effect on these children," he told them. "The end result is almost unfathomable. How many of you would like to have that background as a 7- or 8-year-old?"

The four boys who were victims of the crimes and their mothers were called to testify in the trial late last week. According to their testimony, Flemming moved in with one woman the mother of two of the boys - in June 1979, signed the boys up for Cub Scouts and himself became the cubmaster.

Those boys, then ages 11 and 9, said there had been numerous occasions

when Flemming had molested them. They said they encouraged a third boy to join the Cub Scout pack:

The third boy, a 7-year-old, testified that Flemming had had sexual contact with him in a public swimming pool and at the boy's home when the boy was sick with the flu. The boy's mother said she witnessed one of the sexual activities with which Flemming was charged and reported it to authorities in July 1980.

Just before that time, Flemming had moved in with a Eugene woman who had a 10-year-old son, testimony indicated. That boy said that Flemming had had some form of sexual contact with him "50 times, maybe."

Although there was not much disagreement on whether Flemming had committed the crimes, there was considerable argument on whether he should be held responsible for them. Each side prosecution and defense - called a psychiatrist to the stand and each psychiatrist expressed a different opinion on whether Flemming could have stopped having sex with young boys even if he had realized that what he was doing was illegal.

Called: for the defense was John Carter, a medical doctor who practices psychiatry in Eugene. Carter said he interviewed Flemming three times, gave Flemming various psychological tests and amassed a good deal of Flemming's past history.

pattern of recurrent failures, frustra- \$20,000 fine. tions and poor establishing of relationships, social isolation, excessive drinking, sexual acting out with children and a poor ability to relate in an adult manner to mature women," Carter said.

Carter said Flemming's life has been characterized by recurrent depression and that when Flemming is depressed or feeling stress, his ability to control his impulses is impaired. When anyone is depressed, other disorders may occur, such as over or undereating, alcoholism, or an increase, decrease or change in sexual activity, Carter said.

"An affair is sexual acting out behavfor, but it's relatively more acceptable." Carter said. "This behavior exhibited by Mr. Flemming is an extension of that behavior."

But Paul Bassford, a Springfield psychiatrist called for the prosecution, disagreed. Bassford said his interview with Flemming and his review of Carter's records revealed that Flemming has suffered from long-standing depression, but that Flemming could "appreciate the wrongfuiness of his behavfor" because he is a spiritual, moral, normally law-abiding citizen who had exhibited multiple examples proving he knew his behavior needed to be stopped or controlled

"We all have sexual impulses." Bassford said. "But we show some selectivity for when it is appropriate or inappropriate to have sexual contact. Mr. Flemming willfully controlled or stopped these relations for periods of time because he knew they had to be."

Flemming had exhibited no evidence of hallucinations or delusions. Bassford said. Bassford said Flemming is a pedophillac — a person who believes it is incestuous to have sexual relations with women because all women potentially are seen as mothers so they seek sexual relief in another way, with children. He also said Flemming has an obsessivecompulsive personality, which is the same personality trait that most successful executives exhibit 2 4 1981.

The two psychiatrists — and the two lawyers - agreed that Flemming is not in good shape psychologically. Gough called his client an "ill person who needs treatment." He encouraged the jurors to find Flemming not responsible for his criminal activity so that Flemming could get psychological help.

First-degree sodomy is a Class A felony, punishable by a maximum prison sentence of 20 years and a \$2,500 fine. First-degree sexual abuse is a Class C felony, which carries a maximum fiveyear prison sentence and a \$2.500 fine. In all, Flemming could face a maximum We see (in Flemming) essentially a sentence of 130 years in prison and a

Ex-scout leader charged in sex crimes with boys

A 38-year-old Eugene man who served as a Cub Scout master for two months earlier this year has been charged with eight sex crimes involving four boys in his pack.

Jerrold Steven Flemming, of 462 Jefferson SL, pleaded innocent in Lane County Circuit Court last week to six counts of first-degree sodomy and two counts of first-degree sexual abuse.

Although the Boy Scout district office in Eugene has no record of Flemming being a cub master.

chairman of the advisory committee for a pack from the Whiteaker Elementary School area, says Flemming was cub master of the pack for about two months this spring. She says he had been a member of the committee since last October, when the pack was formed.

says Flemming became involved with the pack through the mother of two of the boys in the group. Those boys, and two other boys Flemming met through pack activities, were the victims of the alleged crimes, according to

According to Deputy District Attorney Zack Lorts, the victims in the cases are 7, 9, 10 and 11 years old. The sexual incidents occurred between June 1, 1979—apparently occurred before Flemming became involved with the cub pack—and July 24, 1980, according to the indictments filed against Flemming.

Lorts says the mother of one of the

boys witnessed one of the sexual activities with which Flemming is charged and reported it to authorities in July. Lorts says Flemming fled to Spokane, Wash., and was extradited from there last week to face the charges.

says when she learned of the allegations, she reported the matter to John Gibbens, a district supervisor in the Eugene Boy Scout office. Gibbens is on vacation this week. Dick Clark, assistant scout executive in the office, said Thursday he hasn't heard anything about the incidents. Clark said Flemming isn't officially registered as a cub master.

"We don't approve or disapprove leaders here at our scout service center," Clark said. "Responsibility for selecting leaders rests with the pack committee, usually a group of parents who pick the leaders to work with their kirk."

says the pack committee will be more cautious in selecting a scout master next time but says there's really no way to determine whether a person has unusual sexual tendencies.

She says the committee basn't decided yet whether to discuss the matter with the other boys in the pack or with their parents. "Right now we're recovering from shock," she says.

Flemming is being held at the Lane County jail in lieu of \$160,000 bail. His cases will be set for trial later.
