Man Held In Morals Charges

A special education teacher at Braddock Junior High School was taken into custody last night by City Police and charged in connection with eight counts of second degree sex offenses.

Arthur Dov Margulies, 30, of 7 Virginia Avenue; is reported to have willingly given himself up to City Police and the State's Attorney's Office, after they went to his home.

He was being held In Allegany County Jail last night in lieu of \$50,000 bond following a hearing before District Court Commissioner Allan Daugherty.

Allegany County State's
Attorney Lawrence V. Kelly

connection with his alleged
activities involving 12 and 13
year old boys.

At the present time, officials report they know of three victims believed to have been part of the activities involving Margulies between November and early this month. City Police said there may be more victims. The alleged activities occurred in the home of the defendant.

Marguiles is also charged with one count of obtaining alcohol for use by minors.

City Police officials, Sgt.
Robert Dick of the city's
Juvenile Intervention Force
(JIF Unit), and Cpl. Ronald
Horn of the investigation
division, and Allegany
County Investigator William
F. Baker are continuing the
investigation.

It is reported the arrest came, after considerable stigative work was done

on the part of the JIF Unit. Information was developed, after the apprehension of a juvenile led to interviews with the young boys. They also advised City Police of the offenses.

The juveniles were reported not to have been physically hurt. However, the Allegany County Health Department is providing counseling and supportive help and the Memorital Hospital Crisis Center will perform examinations, authorities said.

Two Plead Guilty In Juvenile Sex Cases

Two men charged with second-degree sex offenses involving juvenile boys. entered guilty pleas today in Allegany County Circuit Court.

One was given a ten-year jail sentence that was suspended on the grounds he continue receiving psychiatric care, and sentencing was withheld for the other pending the result of efforts to establish him in a psychiatric care program.

Arthur Dov Marguilles, 30. of Virginias Avenue, pleaded guilty to 10 counts of second degree sex offense involving four juvenile boys. As the result of pleabargaining, State's Attorney Lawrence V. Kelly said he would accept guilty pleas in exchange for recommending that he be given a ten-year 'suspended term and placed on five years' active probation.

One of the conditions

probation was that
Marguiles enter and continue a psychiatric care
program. Marguiles' attorney, W. Timothy Finan,
said efforts are under way to
find a proper program.

Assopciate Judge James S. Getty accepted Margulies' guilty plea, but said he would withhold sentencing until a positive hospitalized care program could be found. If none can be found, Judge Getty said Marguiles could "strike the plea bargain and start (the trial process) over again."

In another plea-bargained case, Harry Whinna Lancaster, 44, of Frostburg was given a ten-year suspended sentence, after he pleaded guilty to two counts of second-degree-sex offense and one count of distribution of a controlled dangerous substance (marijuana)

Lancaster was placed on five years' probation, and Judge Getty followed State's Attorney Kelly's recommendation that conditions of the probation include orders that Lancaster continue receiving treatment from the same psychiatrist who has been seeing him for the last few months, that he follow a scheduled plan of treatment the psychiatrist has ordered for him, and that he move away from Frostburg.

State's Attorney Kelly and Lancaster's attorney Gary Leasure said it was agreed' that part of the defendant's problem arose from the area in which he resides and the people with whom he associates.

Kelly said following the trial that there had been several considerations studied in arriving at the plea-bargaining in the two cases, first of them being concern for the victims and the desire not to force them to undergo the trauma of testifying in open court.

He also said that the state was satisfied the procedure would ensure the safety of the public — that the two men would receive needed psychiatric care that would not be available to them in the Maryland penal system which has only limited facilities for treating the mentally-ill. It was felt that no purpose would be served in jailing them, he said.
