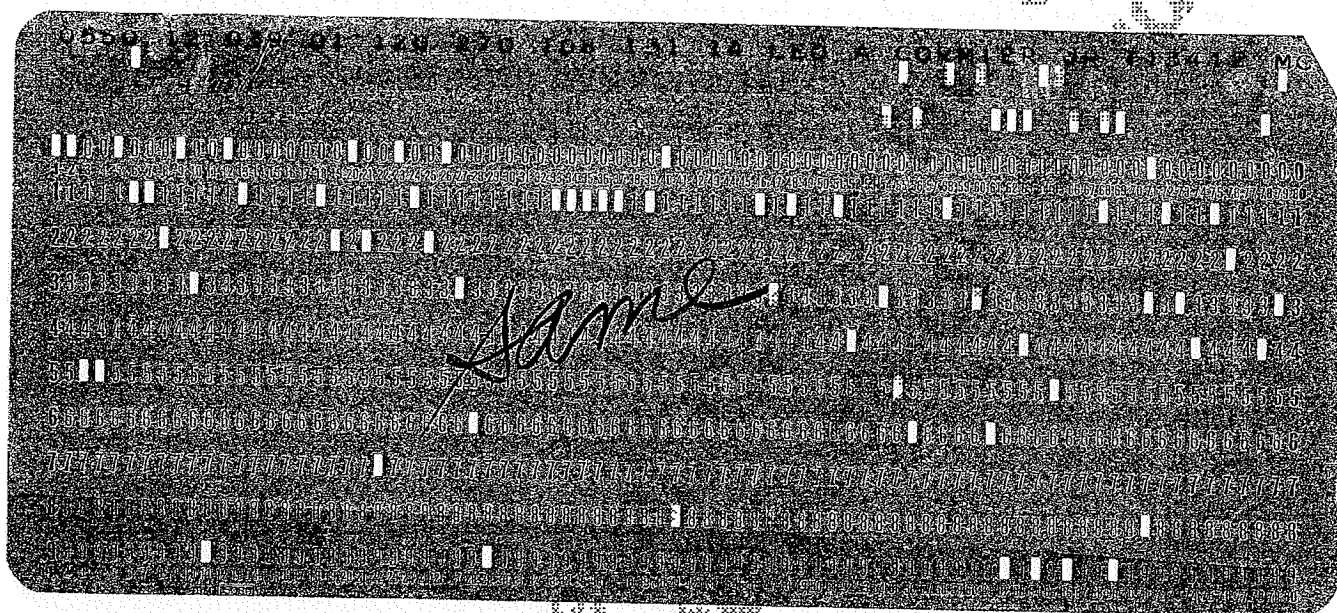

ARTICLE II — PURPOSE: CHARACTER DEVELOPMENT — CITIZENSHIP TRAINING

The purpose of this corporation is as set forth in the original certificate of incorporation under the laws of the District of Columbia, dated February 8, 1910, and restated in Section 3 of the charter granted by Congress June 15, 1916, as follows: "That the purpose of this corporation shall be to promote, through organization, and cooperation with other agencies, the ability of boys to do things for themselves and others, to train them in Scoutcraft, and to teach them patriotism, courage, self-reliance, and kindred virtues, using the methods which are now in common use by Boy Scouts by placing emphasis upon the Scout Oath or Promise and Law for character development, citizenship training, and physical fitness."—*Constitution of the Boy Scouts of America*.

GRANTING COMMISSIONS AND CERTIFICATES OF MEMBERSHIP

The *Constitution and Bylaws of the Boy Scouts of America* authorize commissions and certificates of membership only to those who subscribe to the Scout Oath or Promise, and Law, the declaration of religious principle (as printed below), and its Constitution and Bylaws and are citizens of the United States, or have legally declared their intentions to become citizens of the U. S.

ARTICLE IV—DECLARATION OF RELIGIOUS PRINCIPLE

"Section 1. The Boy Scouts of America maintains that no boy can grow into the best kind of citizenship without recognizing his obligation to God. In the first part of the Boy Scout's Oath or Promise the boy declares, 'On my honor I will do my best to do my duty to God and my country and to obey the Scout Law.' The recognition of God as the ruling and leading power in the universe and the grateful acknowledgment of His favors and blessings are necessary to the best type of citizenship and are wholesome precepts in the education of the growing boy. No matter what the boy may be—Catholic or Protestant or Jew—this fundamental need of good citizenship should be kept before him. The Boy Scouts of America therefore recognizes the religious element in the training of the boy, but it is absolutely nonsectarian in its attitude toward that religious training. Its policy is that the organization or institution with which the Boy Scout is connected shall give definite attention to his religious life."

"Only persons willing to subscribe to this declaration of principle shall be entitled to certificates of leadership in carrying out the Boy Scout program."

THE SCOUT LAW

2. A Scout is loyal.
He is loyal to all to whom loyalty is due, his Scout leader, his home and parents and country.
3. A Scout is helpful.
He must be prepared at any time to save life, help injured persons, and share the home duties. He must do at least one Good Turn to somebody every day.
4. A Scout is friendly.
He is a friend to all and a brother to every other Scout.
5. A Scout is courteous.
He is polite to all, especially to women, children, old people, and the weak and helpless. He must not take pay for being helpful or courteous.
6. A Scout is kind.
He is a friend to animals. He will not kill nor hurt any living creature needlessly, but will strive to save and protect all harmless life.
7. A Scout is obedient.
He obeys his parents, Scoutmaster, patrol leader, and all other duly constituted authorities.
8. A Scout is cheerful.
He smiles whenever he can. His obedience to orders is prompt and cheerful. He never shirks nor grumbles at hardships.
9. A Scout is thrifty.
He does not wantonly destroy property. He works faithfully, wastes nothing, and makes the best use of his opportunities. He saves his money so that he may pay his own way, be generous to those in need, and helpful to worthy objects. He may work for pay, but must not receive tips for courtesies or Good Turns.
10. A Scout is brave.
He has the courage to face danger in spite of fear and to stand up for the right against the coaxings of friends or the jeers or threats of enemies, and defeat does not down him.
11. A Scout is clean.
He keeps clean in body and thought; stands for clean speech, clean sport, clean habits; and travels with a clean crowd.
12. A Scout is reverent.
He is reverent toward God. He is faithful in his religious duties and respects the convictions of others in matters of custom and religion.

BOYS' LIFE

Registered adult members are entitled to a one-half concession rate of \$1.50 a year or 12½¢ a month. (Regular rate is \$3.00.) GRANTING COMMISSIONS AND CERTIFICATES OF MEMBERSHIP

Every person serving in any official relationship with the Boy Scouts of America shall subscribe to the statement of religious principle, the Scout Oath and Law, and the Bylaws. Each such person either shall be a citizen of the United States or shall satisfy one of the following alternative requirements if applicable to him: (a) A person other than a member of the Executive Board or a regional chairman (all of whom must be citizens of the United States) shall legally declare his intention to become a citizen of the United States; (b) A visiting alien, whether adult or minor, shall satisfy the requirements of Article XVI, Section 6, Clause 4 of the Bylaws.

LEO ADRIEN CORMIER has a long record with convictions for sex perversion. In one case he was involved with two young girls, daughters of [REDACTED]. At the subsequent hearing Mrs. [REDACTED] blamed the girls. This man is not employed. The house in which they live is very poorly maintained and is filthy. A local policeman whose son was in the Scout Den brought this to the attention of the District Commissioner and District Executive.
