



Subject: George "Bud" Frie - T 89

Tuesday morning, March 1, 1966, Commander C. Frank Jennings called me at the Scout Service Center. He stated he had a confidential matter to discuss with me, either at my office or his. I went to the Pioneer Post Office where the Commander introduced me to Gunner's Mate 1/C, U.S.N. Mr. related that his youngest son, age 10, had related that on Saturday, February 26, while camped at or near Frog Lake, Mr. Frie had caused the boy to lower his pajamas and proceeded to play with the Boy's genital organs. The father related that his oldest son, had related other occasions when boys had been photographed in the nude, caused to sleep in the same sleeping bag with Mr. Frie, etc.

Two names that were mentioned for further investigation were Chambers and Fitzpatrick.

I set an appointment for 4:30 p.m. March l. at which time I was to speak with both boys and the father. The dad later called to say he could not be present, but that Mrs. would be present.

Mr. Guy P. Miller and I called on Mrs.

S.E. 21 Ave., Portland, telephone 232-7209, at approximately
4:30 p.m. Their younger boy was not at home. Mr. Miller and
the older boy went for a drive looking for the boy. He was not
found.

On their return, Guy Miller, and I had further conversation where names of other boys were implicated:

Let is apparent that it was common knowledge among troop members that Mr. Frie was a "queer." They evidently warned the newer boys to stay away from Mr. Frie.

related that on one or more occasions, Mr. Frie attempted to pull him into his sleeping bag. The mother did not wish to place criminal charges against Mr. Frie, but did volunteer to relate her findings to others if requested in the interest of the Securing movement.

This report is being written at 5:30 p.m. upon my return from the meeting with . Action is deferred to the best judgment of the Scout Executive.
