ARTICLE II — PURPOSE: CHARACTER DEVELOPMENT — CITIZENSHIP TRAINING

"The purpose of this corporation is as set forth in the original certificate of incorporation under the laws of the District of Columbia, dated February 8, 1910, and restated in Section 3 of the charter granted by Congress June 15, 1916, as follows: That the purpose of this corporation shall be to promote, through organization, and cooperation with other agencies, the ability of boys to do things for themselves and others, to train them in Scoutcraft, and to teach them patriotism, courage, self-feliances and kindred virtues, using the methods which are now in common use by Boy Scouts' by placing emphasis upon the Scout Oath or Promise and Law for character development, citizenship training, and physical fitness."—Constitution of the Boy Scouts of America.

GRANTING COMMISSIONS AND CERTIFICATES OF MEMBERSHIP

The Constitution and Bylaws of the Boy Scouts of America authorize commissions and certificates of membership only to those who subscribe to the Scout Oath or Promise and Law, the declaration of religious principle (as printed below), and its Constitution and Bylaws and are citizens of the United States, or have legally declared their intentions to become diffens of the U. S.

ARTICLE IV—DECLARATION OF RELIGIOUS PRINCIPLE

"Section 1. The Boy Scouts of America maintains that no boy can grow into the best kind of catizenship without recognizing his obligation to God. In the first part of the Boy Scout's Oath or Promise the boy declares, 'On my honor I willing the best to do my duty to God and my country and to obey the Scout Law.' The recognition of God as the ruling and leading power in the universe and the grateful acknowledgment of His favors and blessings are necessary to the best type of citizenship and are wholesome precepts in the education of the growing boy. No matter what the boy may be—Catholic or Protestant or Jew this fundamental need of good citizenship should be kept before him. The Boy Scouts of America therefore recognizes the relations element in the training of the boy, but it is absolutely nonsectarian in its attitude toward that religious training. Its pulicy is that the organization or institution with which the Boy Scout is connected shall give definite attenion religious life.

"Only persons willing to subscribe to this declaration of principle shall be entitled to certificates of leadership in carrying out the Boy Scout program.'

He is a friend to all and a brother to every other Scout.

He is polite to all, especially to women, dufficing old people, and the weak and helpless. He must not take pay for being helpful or courteous. courteous.

A Scout is obedient.

8. A Scout is cheerful.

He aniles whenever he can. His obedience to orders is prompt and cheers. He never shirks nor grumbles at hardships.

A Scoutt is thrifty,

He does not wantonly destroy property. He works faithfully, wastes nothing, and makes the best use of his opportunities. He saves his nonewiso that he may pay his own way, be generous to those in need, sand helpful to worthy objects. He may work for pay, but must not receive tips for courtesies or Good Turns.

A Scout is brave.

He has the courage to face danger in spite of fear and to stand up for the right against the coaxings of friends or the jeers or threats of enemies, and defeat does not down him.

11. A Scout is clean,

He keeps clean in body and thought; stands for clean speech, clean sport, clean habits; and travels with a clean crowd.

A Scout is reverent.

He is reverent toward God. He is faithful in his religious duties and respects the convictions of others in matters of custom and religion.

BOYS' LIFE
