Dear Gary,

It is my unfortunate responsibility to report to you that we have removed Arthur Robert METZGER, AO2, USN, 537 14 74, from all active participation with Boy Scout Troop #244 at Naval Air Station, Miramar, California.

He is being processed for discharge from the Navy under an instruction from the Bureau of Naval Personnel which deals with men having a history of past or present homosexual activity. His actions with the boys of the troop first raised the question of his sexual adjustment.

The case was presented to the Naval Investigative Service Office for investigation at the request of the squadron to which the man is assigned. On the basis of statements taken during the investigation, METZGER is being processed for administrative separation from the Navy. He has waived his rights to counsel and is not protesting his forthcoming discharge. The circumstances he relates in his statement support the action being taken.

I strongly recommend that the Boy Scouts of America take action to prevent METZGER's registration with the National Council at any time in the future.



7. A Scout is obedient.

He obeys his parents, Scoutmaster, patrol leader, and all other duly constituted authorities. A STATE

He smiles whenever he can. His obedience to orders is prompt and cheery. He never shirks nor grumbles at hardships.

A Scout is thrifty.

He does not wantonly destroy property. He works faithfully, wastes nothing, and makes the best use of his opportunities. He saves his morrey so that he may pay his own way, be generous to those in need, and helpful to worthy objects. He may work for pay, but must not accepte tips for courtesies or Good Turns;

10. A Scout is brave.

He has the courage to face danger in spite of fear and to stand up for the right against the coaxings of friends or the jeers or threats of enemies, and defeat does not down him,

A Scout is clean.

He keeps clean in body and thought; stands for clean speech, clean sport, clean habits; and travels with a clean crowd.

A Scout is reverent.

He is reverent toward God. He is faithful in his religious duties and respects the convictions of others in matters of custom and religion.

Registered adult members are entitled the a one-half concession rate of \$1.50 a year or 12½/ a month. (Regular rate is \$3.00.)
