This additional information will enable us to identify this individual should he ever again attempt to register in the Scouting prompt. Thanks again for your prompt response and cooperation.

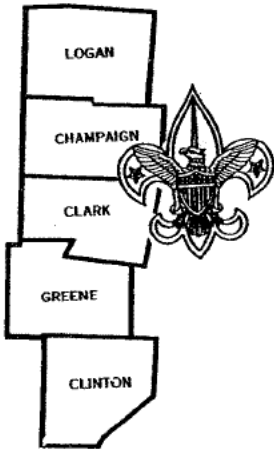

Dear Howard:

At your request, we have investigated actual court records of the case wherein Raymond Porter Michael was convicted in juvenile court:

He took an 11-year old [redacted] girl into his house and took nude photos of her posing in suggestive positions. He admitted taking the pictures, according to the statement made by arresting officers. The physician's report attached to the court record indicated there was no particular evidence of "deviation."

The sentence was \$250 fine with \$200 suspended, and 60 days in jail suspended.

The sponsoring organization removed him from the post, although parents had removed their boys promptly on the first announcement. The sponsor is now engaged in reorganizing the post.

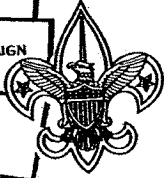
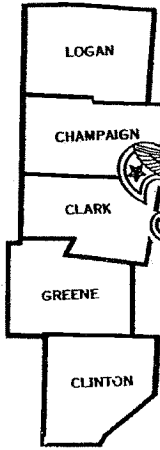

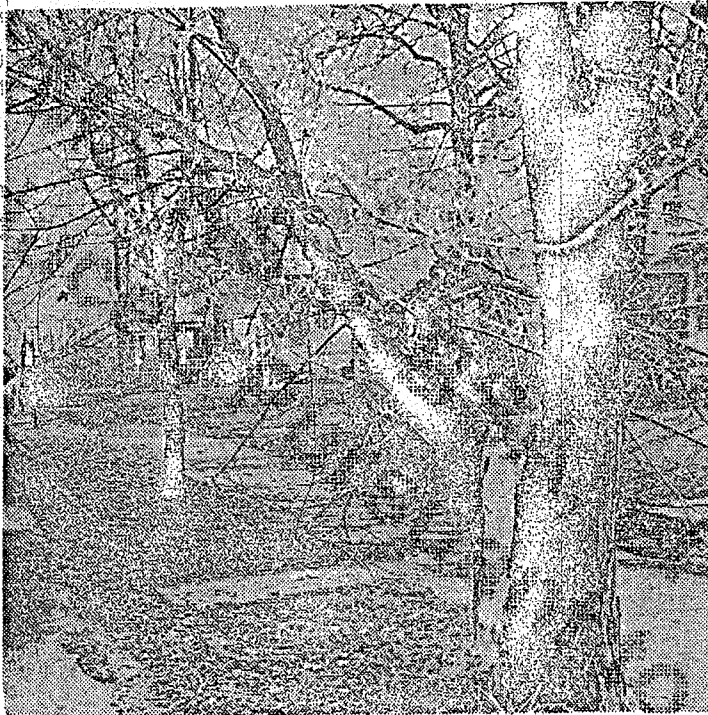

Legal Protesters Are Not Affected By Draft Order

WASHINGTON — (AP) — Selective Service Director Lewis B. Hershey said Wednesday his Oct 26 draft deferment revocation order does not apply to persons legally protesting the draft or the Vietnam war. Hershey, an Army lieutenant general and draft director since 1941, told a news conference his order applies only to those violating a 1967 law. The law provides for jail sentences of up to five years and fines of \$10,000 for those convicted of interfering with the administration of the draft law or regulations issued under it. Hershey contended such violations are a failure to perform duties required under the Selective Service Act which permits draft boards to remove deferments and place the violator at the top of the draft list. Hershey said deferments are granted in the national interest. "It is obvious," he said in a letter to local draft boards last month, "that any action that violates the Selective Service Act cannot be in the national interest and it follows that those who violate the act should be denied deferment in the national interest." When Hershey admitted Wednesday antidraft protests and refusal to carry draft cards have had no effect on recruiting or inductions, he was asked why he thought the crackdown was necessary. "If people are shooting at people and missing them, you wouldn't be content to let them keep on shooting until they hit somebody," he replied.
