Dear Mr. Boyd:

Enclosed is the confidential record sheet for Lee F. Normandie. The suspicion first reported to us came in December as a rumor that a parent in Troop 31 had raised a question about an invitation that his son had received to visit the Scoutmaster. The rumor was discussed with the IR and Chairman. There was nothing concrete, but our recommendation was that he be replaced.

Out District Executive, learning that Normandie had been employed previously in Hartford, Conn, on a hunch contacted the Hartford Police Department. Although no information would be released, it was indicated that there was a record. This was reported to the assistant Pastor of the sponsor, who made a visit to Hartford. He learned that Normandie had been arrested on six counts, two different times, boys 14 to 16, tied up and attacked. Convicted only on "breach of peace", people connected not willing to fully talk about it.

At the time this was being resolved, I received a letter from the father of a Scout in a meighboring town. A copy of this is attached.

As soon as the priest returned with the information, the Troop Committee immediately removed Normandie as Scoutmaster.

I do not have any newspaper clippings or substantiating documents, and I did not personally see the information recorded in the police department files. However, I feel that there is sufficient "reasonable doubt" that this man should not have a commission in Scouting.
