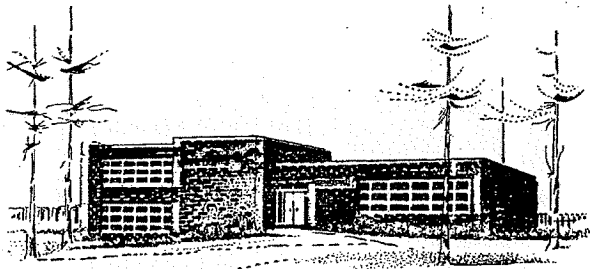

Dear Howard:

A few days ago we forwarded a Separation Notice on District Executive Edwin L. Tenny of our staff, who was accused and admitting to performing homosexual acts with boys.

In brief, the Scoutmaster and some Committee Members of one of our troops came to see me and reported that boys in their troop had been molested by Tenny on several occasions. With Director of Field Service John Bush as a witness, I immediately contacted Tenny and he admitted that he had homosexual tendencies and that he had engaged in homosexual acts with boys. I can supply further details, if you need them, such as names of leaders and boys with whom we have talked.

Of course, I would recommend that you place Tenny on the confidential list, and I would further suggest that you might want to consider some kind of warning letter to Scout Executives. Tenny was very effective as a District Executive and probably had more close friends among unit leaders than any other District Executive on our staff. He had the same ability to win large number of boys as personal followers of his.

I am pointing out these things because we fear he may be drawn into some Scouting circles again, and it would be extremely dangerous for him to associate with boys or leaders anywhere.

It seems that one bit of information about such matters leads to another. We have also found one younger man, a nineteen year old by the name of William Ashley Taylor, who served on

12. Review of each Profession Position:

Nature of Assignment - District Scout Executive for 1/3 Area of Wake County - Headquarters City Raleigh County. Began assignment January 12, 1965.

District served is composed of rural, urban, and suburban areas. The urban area is in the low to medium income range. South Raleigh section is the lowest income area and scouting is available to these boys in six different sponsors.

The suburban area is middle-income and all areas have Scouting available near their homes.

The rural area is made up of seven communities and all have some Scouting Program available.

The largest community outside of Raleigh is Garner and has population of 7,000. This is a bedroom community whose residents mostly rely on Raleigh for employment.

Progress of Scouting attendance of 1965 was 11% increase in membership with 10% in units. Reached cash goal in SME and IMC areas of \$8500. Boys' Life, Camping and advancement goals were also reached.

During 1966, additional assignments were accepted on Council level. Program Director at Council Camp; Council trip director for Area 6-A Order of the Arrow fellowship; Region X Tour Director for Council; functional position for Council Camporee - 3,000 participants; maintained same number of units, total 77, membership 1283 by end of 1966.

During 1967, recruited top community leadership for District Chairman, General manager, Rockwell Manufacturing Co. will continue to serve for second year. District Committee strongest in past three years. District Camporees during 1967 had largest attendance in history of District. District has largest number of Sustaining Membership Contributors in four Wake County Districts.

Held functional position on Council Scout-O-Rama Show during 1965 and 1967. Served as Program Director at Largest council Camp and led two Council Five Day 50-Miler trips, 1965, 1967.

Other functional jobs for Council are associate Advisor for Order of the Arrow (Vigil received November 11, 1967); Associate Advisor to Council Explorer Cabinet; and Council Boys' Life Promotional Director.

Scouting progress at end of 1967 will show about 8-10% increase in advancement; 18% increase in Boys' Life with about 50% members subscribing; and SME and IMC goal reaching about 93% of its goal of \$9,750.

13. Specific Areas of Professional Responsibility in Which Most Proficient:

I feel most proficient in working with volunteer leaders by recruiting and training them to work with boys; in directing any Council assignment in Program areas; in recruiting and directing personnel to conduct community finance campaigns; in administering the overall district program.
