### Judge sentences molester to 10 years of probation

A local man who admitted to molesting a 16-year-old boy was placed on probation for 10 years Tuesday morning in Howard Superior Court 2.

Jay A. Barton, 54, 1228 W. Boulevard, faced a possible nine to 32 years in prison on original charges filed in connection with the molest incident last March 29. Barton was accused of engaging in sexual relations with the 16-year-old boy, who was his newspaper carrier that morning.

He was arrested two days later on felony counts of child molest, criminal deviate conduct and confinement. A plea bargain filed on his behalf early last month allowed him to plead guilty to the molest and deviate charges in exchange for a state motion to

County Probation Department. That office conducted a customary pre-sentence investigation of Barton during the period of Aug. 11-22

Probation Officer Gary Common, in his report to the gourt, suggested Barton receive consecutives and five-year sentences on the 10- and five-year sentences on the child molest and deviate conducts a charges and the sentences be suspended in favor of 10 years of probation.





It is very unusual for an Executive Board to Kind one of their members so far astray that they feel compelled to seek his removal from the program. Such unfortunately is the case with Jay A. Barton of Kokomo, Indiana.

The specific incidents which the Executive Board found to be a violation of the declaration which every adult Scouter signs are quite numerous. However, I shall enumerate only a very few which they feel provide all the basis necessary for their act.

As Chapter Advisor to the Order of the Arrow this man made such loud use of homosexually suggestive language, at the Area H Conclave last spring that other adults felt compelied to ask him to stop. He laughed at them and continued 🗱 🔧

As Chairman of his District Camping Committee, in the presence of a mixed audience of mem and boys he cut his Council Strip from his Uniform and burned same to demonstrate his revolt against the regulations of the Council and at the same time urged others present to do the same.

After being replaced as Chapter Advisor of the Order of the Arrow he induced boy members to circulate a petition requesting the removal of the Council Advisor. This was carefully managered so no direct tie could be established.

Most recently as Associate Advisor to an Air Squadron he has repeatedly flown boys in his own plane without flight clearance from parents add over the protest of the Advisor and the Post Committee.

This is very regretable as the man holds a responsible position with a major industry in Kokomo and thus has a sphere of influence that will windoubtedly be used. However, two of his superiors are party to the action of the Executive Board.

#### SUMMARY OF ACTION TAKEN: THE BOARD VOTED TO:

- 1. APPROVE the minutes of the February 12, 1968, meeting as mailed.
- 2. APPROVE the Report of the Treasurer for the month of February, 1968. Copy stached to Master minutes.
- UNANIMOUSLY request the National Council to revoke the Commission of Jay A. Barton, currently registered in the dual capacity as a member of this Executive Board and as the Associate Advisor of Explorer Post 357 on the grounds that his actions and conduct do not conform to those expected of a Commissioned Scouter.
- 4. ACCEPT the resignation of Robert A. Hardley, effective April 5, 1968, from the position as District Executive of this Council.

#### SUMMARY OF REPORTS AND DISCUSSION:

- 1. Council Commissioner, Right, reported that in visiting the districts this month the primary problem was inadequate manpower to provide satisfactory regular unit help.
- 2. Specific acts leading to the action taken in item 3 of these minutes were:
  (1) Chapter tour without tour permit; (2) Suggestive language in the presence of boys and others; (3) Assignment of debasing nickname; (4) Influencing boys to district Council authority; (5) Public removal of Council identification and destruction of sems; and (6) Unauthorized flight of boys in Post.
- 3. District reports indicate that eleven (11) new units will be organized by the close of April, swim programs are succeeding in three districts, forty-one (41) of the seventy pitential camp sites are taken for this summer, nominating committees are working in all districts, annual meetings will be held as follows: Peshews April 9; Palonswa- April 23; Kweussa and Chippewa April

- 4. The Budget Committee will have to call a special session; to have approval for Howard County United Fund by April 3. Because of rapid price changes the pricing is not yet complete for all program items approved also some work remains from personnel committee report.
- 5. Operating Committee reports show camp spots available for only 19 more units; membership down 623 boys and 4 units from January 1; need for balanced finance program including foundations, sustaining enrollment, and special projects.
- 6. Considerable discussion of "Acres For Boys" program regarding organization of campaign with Palonswa and Chippewa short their general chairmen; Peshewa kicking off with a breakfast on March 16, Kweussa the same on March 23; some problem still to be resolved regarding purchase of the Wagoner acreage.
- 7. Men who attended the Regional Seminars at Bloomington reported that personnel was a major concern and that all councils were being orged to develop the type of Long-Range Plan we are working on. 1969 Regional starting salaries are espected to be \$7,400 and 1970 ones \$8,000.
- 8. All who possibly can are urged to attend the National Council Annual Meeting in Chicago on May 22-23. All who are connected with Long Range Plan should make every effort to attend.
