Dear Howard:

I checked into the "incriminating evidence" reported by the Troop 352 Committee per your request. What actually happened here is that the Committee interviewed boys in the unit and ascertained from these interviews, evidence of perverted sexual trivity. The Committee then, as a group, confronted Mr. Kalasky, who broke down and admitted to the Committee group (the same group that signed the letter) that he was a homosexual and did in fact carry these activities with Scouts in the troop.

The Committee is most vigorous in their desire that there not be any further involvement of the boys of the troop, because of the disturbance it would create. They are most hopeful that their signed statement would suffice. They did not get a signed statement admitting to these things from Mr. Kalasky, and they realize now this was an error. We could have brought that about but we didn't know of the situation until after all of these steps had been taken

I am not sure how much further we would want to pursue this and I seek your advice and guidance.

This should be done by filing with us an additional enrollment for this individual in his new postion. Please do not file a separation notice as we have already dropped the current leader.


