Dear Howard:

This pertains to a case of alleged perversion which occurred at a district camporee on Friday and Saturday, September 6 and 7, 1968.

The story I am going to relate has been told to me erronally by five or six first and second hand witnesses. Major George I. Kennedy, Jr., U.S. Army, is assigned to Sandia Base, Labuque age. New Mexico and was helping organize and run a district camporee. This was to be a 'hike in' camporee with patrols hiking from a base camp to a remote site. Major Kennedy selected one boy, an Eagle Scout and camp staff member, to help him set up camp at the remote site. During the late part of the day, several witnesses say he exposed himself in various stages of undress. Only he and the boy were to remain overnight at the remote site. A camp was set up and because it was cold and at a high altitude Major Kennedy suggested that they zip their sleeping bags together. After retiring, he began discussing the lack of sexual relations with his wife and then began making advances to the boy. The boy is approximately to and is in good physical condition and wrestled with Major Kennedy and finally escaped by chocking him severely around the neck. He ran off into the night woods sometime around midnight clad only in his shorts. He walked the approximate five miles to the base camp and meanwhile bedded down and slept part of the night and then walked into camp of his own troop the following morning around 9 or 9:30 A.M.

The parents of the boy were informed and the father arrived in camp shortly after the boy showed up. At first, he commented the reason he ran away was that he had a personal disagreement with Major Kennedy. After a personal and private talk with his father, the boy told the above story. Fortunately, Dr. Frank Hess was one of the two or three witnesses to the boy's return in the camp and heard his complete story as described above. The boy later told this story directly to me in the presence of his parents and it was the same each time.

A co-worker (army officer, Captain was one of the withesses to the boy's return to camp and heard the full story. Both Captain Kennedy have the highest security clearance in the U. S. Army Captain Captain therefore obliged to report the action and his full knowledge immediately to his superior officer.

A State Police Officer was called (when it was first reported the boy was lost early in the morning - about 6:00 A.M.). So there was a police officer present when the boy came into camp. The boy gave the officer a complete account of the incident and this account is on file with the police confidential files.

It is my understanding that the army has removed Major Kennedy from his position and is conducting a complete psychiatric examination and investigation of the event.

The parents appear to be very evasive about what action they ultimately plan to take. I have gotten the impression that if Major Kennedy seeks psychiatric care and treatment, the parents may not press formal charges.

Since this event, two more alleged cases concerning Major Kennedy have been brought to my attention concerning officer boys

It is our understanding that Major Kennedy is an Eagle Scout and originally from Oklahoma and could well return there if he is separated from the service.

I will keep you informed that are developments.
