Dear Peter,

It is the intention of this letter to inform you officially of the existence of certain charges pending against the above captioned Donald (Scotty) Waller, whom I understand to be a committeeman for the Hawley Boy Score Troop.

Several months ago we received information concerning the alleged homosexual behavior of Waller with young boys. Since the principal complaining witness was charged in Juvenile Court with delinquency and since he appeared to be of a rather low intelligence, we did not choose to prosecute at that time.

In the meantime, however, the investigation has continued and with the availability of more credible evidence, charges consisting of sodomy, solicitation to commit sodomy and contributing to the delinquency of a minor have been filed against Waller with a local Justice of the Peace. Mr. Waller has walved hearing on these charges and has posted bail for presentation of the same to our April 1969 Grand Jury.

I well realize the precepts of our system of jurisprudence, one of the greatest of which is the presumption of innocence.

It is my general understanding from speaking with the investigators in this case that the guilt of the defendant can be established and that in all likelihood the defendant will enter a plea.

I will leave it entirely to your discretion and that of your superiors concerning any action that may be taken involving Mr. Waller. As indicated, I suppose there is some question of securing his dismissal and/or his resignation as committeeman, at least until such time as his guilt has been established. However, I would expect that upon receipt of this information, proper steps would be taken to assure that pending the completion of this case Mr. Waller was not solely responsible for the care of adolescent boys.

If you or your superiors would desire any further confirmation concerning the existence of these charges, I shall be pleased to meet with you or your superiors at any mutually satisfactory time.
