

Dear Howard:

Our Council has just finished reviewing a moral's case concerning Dr. John C. Weeter who is registered as a mate in Sea Scout Ship 180.

Two past council presidents, Judge J. Paul Keith, Charles J. Weber, and myself read from the files of the Louisville Police Department about the activities of a group of prominent Louisvillians and a number of juveniles with whom they performed immoral acts.

These were signed statements made to members of the police department by some twenty-five juveniles. Several of the statements mentioned Dr. Weeter being present at the time the perversion took place but only one stated that they knew Dr. Weeter had relations with boys.

Only one member of the Sea Scout Ship was involved and he stated that Dr. Weeter had invited him to his home alone, gave him several alcoholic drinks and showed him dirty pictures.

On the basis of this evidence, Judge Keith had a conference with Dr. Weeter and we have Dr. Weeter s resignation from Scouting in our hands.
