

Dear Howard:

This is a final report on Jimmie Bischoff, formerly a member of our staff.

On January 25 and 26 Jimmie's trial was held in Circuit Court in the County seat of Ingham County which is Mason.

I was in attendance at most of the trial and appeared as a witness to establish the fact that at the time we hired Jimmie Bischoff he was throughly checked out and that there was no indication of homosexual tendencies.

I appeared as a witness on the advice of our lawyers to establish the fact that we are very careful in our recruiting methods and to clear the name of the Boy Scouts of America.

The trial was a jury trial and the Judge was Louis E. Coash. The jury returned a vendict of guilty.

On February 17 the Judge sentenced Jimmie Bischoff to three years probation and five hundred dollars fine and costs.

The entire case was handled with a very minimum of publicity. In so far as I have been able to determine there have been no instances of homosexual acts involving Scouts or Scout Leaders.

It is most adequate and we are appreciative of this concluding information. It really is too bad that a person who apparently has the ability that he has couldn't handle himself properly. Jimmie Bischoff is now employed as a salesman for Ollivetti-Underwood Agency in Chicago. He has been very successful and has received one or two promotions and is one of their better salesmen. As of the day of the trial he had made twelve visits to a psychiatrist and will continue this treatment for an indefinite period.

He received terminal pay for one months salary from our Council and has been dismissed from our employ since his arrest last July. The lawyer for Jimmie Bischoff is Mr. Fred Abood here in Lansing. So far as I can determine this closes the case on Jimmie Bischoff.

We are wondering whether this case has come before the courts as yet? If so, we would appreciate hearing from you so that we may complete our records regarding this matter.







> Subject: Dismissal of Jimmie Bischoff District Executive

Dear Skipper:

On July 27, 1964, Jimmie Bischoff who at that time was employed as a District Executive by the Chief Okemos Council, Boy Scouts of America was arrested in one of the mens rest rooms in the Union Building of Michigan State University. He was charged with gross indecency. Jimmie Bischoff not knowing that this man was a detective approached him to engage in a homosexual act. At this point he was arrested and signed a confession indicating that he had done this on previous occasions and that he started his homosexual activities while he was in the Navy. He spent the night in jail and was released the following day on a \$1,000 bond. This was not brought to my attention until the following Friday, July 11. On Monday, August 3, I met with Jimmie Bischoff to discuss the situation but he refused to tell me any thing and referred me to his lawyer. His lawyer in turn told me very little.

On Tuesday August 4, I conferred with Jimmie Bischoff and informed him that he was not longer employed by the Boy Scouts of America.

Since that time he has left the city and is now living at 1913 N. Sheffield Chicago 14. Illinois. I have not seen him since then or have I had any correspondence with him.

In the meantime we have employed Robert Arnold who was recruited in the Harrison Trails Council at Lafayette, Indiana. He is now at Schiff Scout Reservation and will take over the districts formally served by Jimmie Bischoff.

It is my understanding that Jimmie Bischoff will come to trial before the Circuit Court here in the next few weeks. At present this is all the information I have.

On the basis of these findings I am sure you will have him put on the confidential list. If you need any further information on this case I will be glad to furnish what I can.
