

Last week I had the opportunity to visit with Mr. Passell Conway, principal of the Alcona High School in Lincoln, Michigan, about Douglas L. Brown of that city. In referring to your letter of November 13th, may I suggest that due to the large area of this council the procedures followed in this case had been previously used many times. After talking with Jim Bourque I find that I was not immediately available to him, and that his letter to you was done in the interests of the supposed emergency.

Douglas L. Brown was under surveillance by the administration of the Alcona High School administration for some time prior to the attempted registration with the Boy Scouts of America. Mr. Conway would be happy to correspond directly with you and bring you up to date on the particulars. His resignation was not precipatated only by the refusal of the Boy Scouts of America.

Mr. Conway further advised me that Mr. Brown is still in Lincoln, Michigan and talks of bring suit against Mr. Conway and the school administration et all. This may well include the Boy Scouts of America. Hence, the case of Mr. Brown may not yet be closed. We'll keep you posted.





I have before me a letter written by James Bourque concerning Douglas L. Brown. Attached to his letter to me; copy of which he indicates he sent to you. Is the original letter of inquiry I wrote you on September 27. Across the top in typed in red ink. Jim, resu and check and return to me with the desired information. Parhaps another Glennie. I am enclosing a photo copy of both of these letters for your information.

There deems to be no quediton about the identity of Douglas L. Brown since it is quite clear that br. Brown, attempting to register in Troop 95, is the same as the Mr. Brown on whom we have information. As I indicated in the last paragraph of my September 27 letter, we regret to advise you that we cannot accept his regulation in the Boy Scours of America. So far as we are concerned, this classes the case on Mr. Brown.

As you well know, we do not and cannot provide any information to anyone conserving any individual on whom we have confidential information. For this reason, therefore, I am in no position to give you any further information other than the statement just above, namely, that we cannot accept his registration.

I would like to telk with you for a few minutes about Mr. bourque's correspondence. It means to me that this young man needs guidence. In the first place, it looks to me like he completely disregarded your notation that was typed at the top of my September 27 letter and instead of providing you with the desired information, he wrote to me directly. Although you may have subsequently told him to write to be, we do not correspond with enyone other than Scout Executives when we are desling with confidential cases. For these two reasons, therefore, I suppose his letter was a little out of order.

Parther, it looks like he is in some minor difficulties and will have some explaining to do why he doesn't have information as he has promised. The third sentence of his third paragraph says that when he talked with the President of the Beard of Education, he told him he would find out the reasons for Brown's rejection. Bourque was completely off base at this point as we never give out any information and he should be made to understand this.

Further, he has relayed a request from Brown that I write him (Brown) directly presumably telling Brown why we won't accept his registration. Of course, this is also absolutely impossible. The only time we would write to Brown, is if Brown first wrote to us and them we would tell him absolutely mething, other than acknowledging his letter and savising him that the National Council reserves the right to register those individuals it feels are beet qualified to serve the best interests of the Boy Scouts of America. We would at no time tell him why we would not consider him application favorably, nor the assurce of our information, nor would we make any accusetions.


It is, of course, most infortunate that Bourque's inquiry from the man in whom he put confidence to help seek put the information regarding identity, as we requested, passed slong to others. Presumably this is not Bourque's fault if he properly contioned the fedividual shead of time. Since the matter has now leaked out, it would seem to me that the only thing that can be done is for you to personally handle the situation by talking to Mr. McIntyre and suplaining may the Boy Scouts of America neither can, nor will, provide him with any information, and also talk with Mr. Brown advising him of the same thing.

I regret the way this situation has developed and I am sure you will have some corrective disqueston with Bourgue concerning the situation.



Dear Skipper:

You will remember that we had a Douglass Brown registered for the last Training School and some circumstances arose, which made it necessary for us to cancel him out of the school. I should like to give you a report on this matter.

We have checked into the rumors, which we heard, concerning this young man's activity with a Boy Scout Troop. We fine that a number of parents of Scouts in that Troop seemed to be personally convinced that he had some immoral contact, or at least made approaches of immoral nature to boys in the Troop. They have been unable to get any positive proof on this, but did force him to leave the Troop as Scoutmaster. This happened about two years ago. The Council office was not informed of the situation. At a later date he became a Scoutmaster of still another Troop. We have taken him off the Scoutmaster role in the present Troop, and have talked to the present Troop leadership about the reasons for it.

Those folks, who are in the position to know most about this young man, are unwilling to make a statement, which can be legally used in any way. All they will mention is suspicion. This makes it impossible for us to take any further action, other than refuse to register him in our Council.

Since my conversation with him about this matter, he has failed to make any attempt to clear the matter as he indicated he could and would. If this much information is sufficient to put this fellow on our confidential list, i should like to request that it be done.

For the above reasons, we should like to suggest that his name be permanently removed from the Prospective Professional Scouter lists.

Since this alleged activity with the Scout Troop, the young man has been married and has a youngster.
