My dear Mr. Mendenhall, My husband and I have been requested to prepare a statement concerning a recent incident during which Mrs. Ray Culverson, former advisor to Post 547, attempted to have our son perform an indecent, immoral act upon Mr. Culverson.

We are expressing our sincere hope other boys will be spared the ordeal to which our son, Tim, and our nephews Dennis and Warren, have been subjected.

Before we reported the incident we interrogated our son thoroughly. He stressed the seriousness of the charge, and made sure he knew exactly what he was doing and how far-reaching the results of this charge would be on Mr. Culverson's entire life. It was at this time that Tim told us of the incident involving our nephews, [REDACTED], at Allegany State Park in

August, 1961. This was at a time when both the Carr families were camping as family units and The Post(547) was there on a long term camping expedition.

It was also while we were discussing with our son the necessity of having positive facts to substantiate his charge that he told us why he had steadily refused to consider applying for a merit badge in physical fitness. The reason he had fulfilled all requirements for this badge and was trying hard for his "Star Scout". Yet [REDACTED] refused to go to Mr. Culverson to give the test for that particular badge and instead, completed requirements for a different badge.

Now he confessed he knew of at least one other boy whom he mentioned by name, who had gone to Mr. Culverson by appointment, and forced " " into the nude, and had been forced to commit an indecent act under threat of bodily harm. I do not include the boy's name because I felt it would

he an invasion of his privacy. The
hope he will, in due time, come
forward with his own statement

Since our son, by [REDACTED]
had been able to avoid Mr. [REDACTED]
advances, we were still undecided as to
what course to pursue. The boys, our
son, our nephew, and the third boy
got together at a troop meeting, discussed
their predicament and decided to take
matters in their own hands. They
felt the boys acted without malicious
intent and in complete trust and
confidence in their Scoutmaster. Their
faith was completely justified. Mr.
Stoyakow and Mr. [REDACTED] handled
the case in what we feel has been a
most sympathetic, delicate and efficient
manner. It is to their ever lasting
credit that they have acted in this
regard to fulfill our trust in the
Scouting movement.

The incident involving
our son, [REDACTED], and Mr.
Culverson, occurred at Camp Takahito
on a weekend when new members,
candidates, were being initiated into
the Troop's Order of the Tomahawk.

[REDACTED] was asked by Mr.
Culverson to accompany him in placing
one of the candidates. [REDACTED] said he
and [REDACTED] (Tom's cousin) would go. [REDACTED] objected, saying there would be [REDACTED] many
in the group; that [REDACTED] would go with
someone else. NOTE — part of the ritual
calls for candidates to spend part of the
night sleeping alone in the open, apart from
the main tenting area). Ray (Mr Culverson)
told [REDACTED] he knew a "real good" place to
place their candidate and they took the
boy and left him in the area chosen.
After they left the boy Mr Culverson
stopped and suggested they wait a while
to be sure the candidate was all right
because [REDACTED] (Mr Culverson) thought the boy
was asleep.
