
This matter has caused me a rot of unnecessary embarrassment that I do not care to go through again, let the matter die.

Dear Troop 362 Parent:

I am sure that by this time you have either read or heard about the articles appearing in the Wednesday editions of the Virginian-Pilot and Ledger Star concerning certain morals charges which have been placed against Mr. I inwood M. Culpepper, a member of the Troop 362 Committee. The articles, particularly the one appearing in the Virginian-Pilot, are not only in extremely bad taste in that they specifically point out the number of our troop, the name and address of our sponsor, the Community United Methodist Church, but also the Pilot article even contained a picture of Mr. Culpepper. Because of the nature and seriousness of the allegations, which include ten separate counts of taking sexual liberties and two counts of sodomy involving some each boys, some of whom are scouts belonging to this troop, and because the atticles are extremely misleading, I and the remaining members of the groop Committee felt it essential that we communicate with each of you immediately in order to set the record straight and to provide you with whatever information we have been able to obtain.

My personal conversation with the arresting officer, the inquiries of my colleagues on the Troop Committee, in addition to the information obtained from the parents of some of the boys involved, reweal the following facts:

- (1) Contrary to the strong implications contained in the articles that the alleged offenses took place on official froop 362 camp outs dating from last November, this is most emphatically not the case, and we have requested the newspaper to set the record straight; hopefully, this will have been done by the time you read this letter. Rather, the alleged offenses all are said to have taken place in Mr. Culpepper's camper while it was parked next to his garage or on camping trips in which boys accompanied Mr. Culpepper, most of whom reside in his neighborhood and some of whom are Troop 362 scouts.
- (2) By contrast, official proop camp outs are rigidly controlled. There is always at least an assistant Scoutmaster and/or a troop dad accompanying the Scoutmaster. The adults sleep together in a staff tent and do not sleep in the same tent with the boys. The boys must sleep in their tents and are not permitted to sleep in campers on official camp outs. Although Mr. Culpepper has brought his camper on one outing, scouts have only been permitted to load or unload supplies from it and have not been allowed in it at any other time.
- (1) On every camp out in which Mr. Culpepper has accompanied the Troop, he has had very few. If any, opportunities to be alone with any scout and neither Tony LaRusso, Jim Sovocool, Bob Crispin nor Percy Patterson have seen anything untoward whatever in Mr. Culpepper's behavior. Our inquiries reveal that on the one instance in which a scout was alone with Mr. Culpepper for any appreciable period, nothing untoward occurred.

- (4) Mr. Charlie Odum, a scout executive, attended our Committee meeting at my home on Wednesday night. He explained that National Scout Headquarters maintains a file on all cases of this nature involving scout leaders. If a person with a previous history of these kind of offenses subsequently registers, the unit concerned is supposed to be notified we have been informed that Mr. Culpepper has been allegedly involved in a similar case in a nearby city some years ago, but for some reason we were not informed of this. In any event, the first inkling that I, or any off my fellow committeemen had of any charges involving Mr. Culpepper was when we opened our Virginian-Pilot on Wednesday morning. I can offer no reason why the National Headquarters warning scheme was not activated in this case.
- (5) On Monday evening, Mr. Culpepper called Mr. Patterson and informed him it was necessary to immediately sever all ties with the troop. Mr. Culpepper gave no reason for his resignation and Mr. Patterson did not delve into the reasons for his decision. In any event, as of Monday evening, June 10, 1974, Mr. Culpepper is no longer associated with Troop 362 in any capacity, at his request.
- (6) At the regular meeting of the troop held last night, Mr. Patterson, in his Scoutmaster's Minute, counseled the boys at to the harm which can be caused by wagging tongues and gossip, and requested that the matter not be discussed among members of the troop.

Needless to say, this entire affair must be an extremely traumatic experience for the relatively small number of boys and their families involved. Reverend Moyer, who, incidentally, attended our Committee meeting and indicated his unqualified support of the troop in general and the Committee in particular, has kindly offered to meet with any family who feels his ministry would be of assistance. If I, or any other Committee member, can be of assistance, all you have to do is ask.

It is hoped that I have answered any questions you might have had in connection with this entire affair. In the event this is not the case, you are cordially invited to a special Committee meeting mext Wednesday night, 19 June, at 7:30 p.m. at the Community United Technodist Church, 1060 Kempsville Road. All Committee members who have been on camp outs with Mr. Culpepper will be in attendance, as well as the Scoutmaster and Assistant Scoutmasters. We will endeavor to answer any of your questions as frankly and completely as we know how.

In closing, let me state from the bottom of my heart that we have one of the finest troops anywhere, with a wiable, hard-working Committee and a truly dedicated and outstanding Scoutmaster. In view of the fact that there is absolutely no evidence that but truly outstanding program is in any way involved in any of the allegations, outside of the fact that Mr. Culpepper has served on the Committee for some six months and that some of the boys involved happened to belong to this troop, it is our fervent hope that we don't lose one single scout as a result of this incident.



Ex-Scouter Gets Probation In Sex Case

VIRGINIA BEACH—Linwood who admitted committing sexual improprieties with youngsters placed in his charge. Wednesday was placed on 10 years' supervised probation.

Circuit Court Judge Austin E. Owen imposed the suspended sentences on Culpepper's guilty pleas to 10 misdemeanor sex of-fenses after the defense and the prosecutor agreed that the State Penitentiary was no place to send Culpepper

"There's no help there (for Culpepper)," attorney A. Joseph Canada Jr. contended. "Sending thing for him; he'd come out a worse man."

Commonwealth's Atty. Andre Evans conceded that prison would not accomplish much but that Culpepper should be kept under the court's careful supervision lest he repeat the offenses.

"Although the psychiatrist indicates that Culpepper represents no danger to society, that is no excuse for his actions," said Evans.

In fact, this was the second time that Culpepper has been charge with sexual offenses against Scouts under his supervision. In 1962, Culpepper, then a Scout leader in Norfolk, pleaded guilty to a reduced charge of disorderly conduct after he was charged with molesting two Scouts.

Culpepper, contending that he is "truly sorry for these acts," testified Wednesday that he had sought psychiatric treatment after the Norfolk incident but his psychiatrist committed suicide shortly after he entered treat-

As conditions of his probation, Judge Owen said that Culpepper must continue in psychotherapy until released by his psychiatrist and "take no leadership or any supervisory position with youth groups of any kind.

In the earlier Norfolk case, a judge had also forbidden him to return to scouting.

Culpepper, described in a presentence report as a good father with two children, said he had even sold his home in his old Kempsville neighborhood after the recent charges. Some of the Scouts' parents lived nearby and "were upset" about the offenses, he testified.
