We know enough to activise that Brandon P. Gray should never again be registered in any capacity with the Boy Scouts of America.

You should also know that he is under the care of a doctor (psychiatrist) in the hope that he can eventually overcome this serious problem of his.

The employment of Brandon P. Gray, District Scout Executive, has been terminated by myself and the Morris-Sussex Area Council for reason of a form of illness which precludes further services in the Boy Scouts of America.

He has been relieved of all duties effective immediately and employment will be terminated thirty days from this date. Basis for this action revolves around an incident which took place at Camp Mt. Allamuchy on February 2-3, 1963 as follows in brief form.

Mr. Gray, while attending a Klondike Derby conducted by one of his Districts, became inebriated. In the evening a member of the Commissioner Staff walked into a cabin and found Mr. Gray playing cards with a group of Explorer Scouts, and attempted to have them discontinue because money was in evidence in violation of camp policy. Mr. Gray resisted this effort and resisted effort to separate him from approximately six boys and three adult leaders in the cabin at the time. It was finally necessary to move the boys to another cabin. Mr. Gray in the meantime attempted to strike a Scouter but missed. The other Scouters then subdued Mr. Gray and after a short while, he went to sleep

Prior to the arrival of the Commissioner and while playing cards, Mr. Gray was observed molesting an Explorer Scout sitting at his side. One of the Scouters present moved the boy from his position beside Mr. Gray. Apparently no further action was taken in an effort to avoid a 'scene' and because of the realization that Mr. Gray was in a highly inebriated condition:

SERVING THE GROWING BOY POPUL ATION OF MORRIS AND SUSSEY COUNTIES

During the period 8:30 P.M. Saturday and 6:30 A.M. Sunday steps taken on my part were directed to isolation of Mr. Gray, suppression of spread of incident beyond group with knowledge of it, obtaining medical advice for handling situation in cooperation with Mrs. Gray, taking Mr. Gray, at his request, to a mental hospital where he admitted himself voluntarity.

On Sunday met with the Explorer mentioned above, in the presence of a Scouter, and he confirmed the violation.

Investigation since reveals at least one further attempt to molest a Scouter and that Mr. Gray's problem has apparently existed since he was a teenager.

Mr. Gray was released from the hospital resterday, February 7, 1963. He requested a meeting and at this meeting I informed him that his employment had been terminated.

More detailed information can be supplied if needed.
