

Dear Mr. Tilson:

A short time ago I received a phone call free the Johnstown Chief of Police and Mayor (who is on our Executive Board sighting two Scouters who had been charged by the police department on a morals charge. They indicated that these cases would some before the courts on August 6, 1962.

The results of these hearings leave no dough that both Scouters are guilty as charged and should be reroved from the ranks of Scouting. May I request that their names be placed of our confidential file and removed from the registration records at our National Office.

The basic history of the two men charges is as follows:

Robert B. Updyker age 25, Malving at Building 47, Apt. B, Oakhurst Homes, Johnstown Penns lvania. Mr. Updyke served as Assistant Scoutmaster and Scoutmaster of Croop served as assistant secutinaster and scoutmaster of droop 186, spoint and by the Cakhurst Citizens Group from Larch, 1959, to October, 1960. He was asked to resign by the Committee following a number of reports by parents that his sections during camping trips was suspicious. He has not peen registered in Scouting since that time, but no definite professor his guilt was evident until yesterday's session in scouting. Even though he is not currently registered as the section of the convenient of the section of th istered, actuare cortain that any reregistration on his part along titure time would be detrimental to Scouting. Harry Matrick Holtzman, age 25, 624 Linden Avenue, Johnstown, Fennsylvania, is an Sagle Scout having recellued this honor in 1954 in this Council. Since that time he has served as Scoutmaster of Troop 33, St. Fairick's Catholic Church; Scoutmaster of Troop 1to; Wakhurst Citizens Croup; and Assistant Scoutmaster of groop 189, Somkeless Group of Citizens. Within the last month he had submitted his reregistration fee of \$1.00 to this office as Assistant Scoutmaster of Troop 189. Knowing the case was pending in court, we held his \$1.00 and have returned it to him as noted in the enclosed letter. (No letter was sent to Updyke in as much as he basn't been registered since 1960.)

EBENSBURG Roberts Updyke of Oakhurst Romes Johnstown was handed a county jail term of 2 to 5 years Monday when he pleaded guilty to serious goods charges.

Updyke 5 admitted to 3 counts plus an additional charge of solicitation to commit a similar offerse. The case involved minor boys:

Harry Patrick Holtzman of 624
Linden Avenue, Johnstown, was ordered to serve 6 months to 2 typers in the county jail on his guilty plea to a serious morals charge concerning a 15-year-old charge concerning a 15-year-old boy.

Pleads Guilty

In another case, the court jailed Mae Berrian of 242 Prospect Street, Johnstown, after she plead-ed guilty to neglecting 3 of her children.

A suspended sentence was issued in the case of Robert Ardary of 670 Park Avenue, Johnstown, who pleaded guilty to 2 burglary

The 18-year-old defendant, who was directed to pay costs and make restitution, was charged with entering the Deardorff & Huey Paint Shop, 439 Horner Street, Johnstown, on Oct. 1, 1961, and on June 26, 1962.
