Is a Silver Beaver holder and additional information may be secured from his application. We have followed up on this and the charges are true.

He worked for many years as an electrical engineer for the Carolina Power and Light Company of Hartsville. About a year or more ago, he was to be promoted and transferred but left their employment because of his desire to remain in Hartsville. Is now employed by Sonoco Products Company of Hartsville as an electrical engineer.
