



Dear Howard.

In regards to yours of February 19, 1965 and Frank E. Tinker, our District Executive again interviewed the pastor of the Springuill Missionary Baptist Church (head of sponsoring institution) who gave the following statement:

"MR. TINKER was involved in homosexual relations with a Boy Scout in the troop (54) on troop camping trips. The incident was related to the pastor by another Scout. The pastor immediately began consultation with Tinker and the Scout involved. Tinker resigned his job with International Paper Go. in Springhill, La. and moved to Alabama where he has been re-employed as a Forester. There have been no sworm statements of complaint from boys or parents. The minister has worked closely with the boy involved and he is progressing well toward overgoming the experience. The incident has been kept quiet to the extent that only three adult troop committmen and the pastor are aware of it. Mr. Tinker's family is still in Springhill where his wife teaches school. The community nor the Scouters of Springhill are aware of the problem. The troop is being reorganized under new leadership."

I hope this information is sufficient. It is about all we can get out of the minister.

Are there any affidevits from parents, or boys, or others? We will appreciate your sending us whatever material of this nature you possibly can, together with a more detailed explanation of the situation.


