

He is married. Wife's name is Carol. He has three daughters 15-13-11 yrs., and a 2 year old son.

He received his eagle award through Troop 2, Fulsa Oklahoma, and was active there for about 7 years. He served in the Navy. He is a graduate of the University of Cincinnati.

Scouting Service in this Council:

Assistant Scoutmaster and Scoutmaster of Troop 16, Centerville, Indiana, from September 1952 to present time. Has also served in various capatities on the Old Trail District Committee as Institutional Representative of Troop 2 from his church, District Camping and Activities Chairman. Was lay Order of the Arrow Advisor in 1958; received the Scouters Key 10-1956; was recognized with the council Bronze Scout Award in June 1961, and was honored by the council with the Stlver Beaver in November 1962.

Details of this case are in the hands of the Wayne County Prosecutor, Mr. Wayne Tash, although no formal action has been filed by the parents of the boys molested, as of this date. Mr. Tash and the County Chairman of the political party to which Mr. Rhedes belongs, have conferred with the parents of several of the boys. Their indings concur with our own investigation started a month or six weeks ago when first brought to our attention. Mr. Tash and the County Chairman went to Indianapolis and confronted Senator Rhodes. He would

neigher deny or admit to the acts of perversion. He did say that he was aware of the talk going around, and that where there is smoke there is usually fire. Mr. Rhodes agreed that he would resign from all Scouting connection; would discontinue the practice of taking boys to Indianapolis to serve as Pages in the Senate; and that he would agree to secure and undergo psychiatric treatment. (This was on Monday of this week)

In our searching the past few days the office of Mr. Tash and ourselves have secured the names of nine (9) boys who have served as Pages in the Senate at Indianapolis starting in January of this year, or during the assembly term two years ago. We now know that there are many more, but there is no real need for further investigation at this time. Our search to date has not produced any indication that immoral acts were committed on boys on any Scouting function or camp.

As far as we have been able to determine, Mr. Rhodes has invited boys to serve a day as a Page in the Senate; taken the boy back with him on Sunday night when he returned to Indianapolis in preparation for the Monday morning session; and there in his hotel room manipulated or attempted to manipulate the sexual organs of of the boy, and has tried to induce the boys to manipulate his own organs, that is Mr. Rhodes. Many of the boys have left the hotel room; spent the night in a chair or tocked in the wash room; and some of them have xxx spent the night mostly in the Indianapolis bus station until they could catch a bus home.

May I point out, that as of this date, neither Mr. Tash or ourselves are in pocession of a signed statement by Mr. Rhodes, or a formal complaint or action by any parent. Much depends on the actions of Mr. Rhodes in the next few days. But the experience should be clear that this man must be removed from our Scouting program at once.

Please advise if any additional information or action is needed.
