Dear Paul:

I received your letter regarding Richard John Turley, and hope the following clarifies the matter.

To the best of my knowledge, this was Turley's second year serving as Program Director in one of our camps. One weekend at Lost Valley Scout Reservation, he asked one of the Scoutmasters to allow his son and two other young boys to remain at camp on Saturday after the troop went home, and he would take them to their home on Sunday. When he did take the boys to the home of the Scoutmaster, they immediately disclosed there had been molestation of all three of the youths, and they had spent the night in a tent other than where Turley was sleeping.

Turley was confronted by the father of one of the boys (the Scoutmaster) and without a word got in his car and left for camp. As a result of a telephone call from the Scoutmaster and the other two fathers, our Camp Director, John LaBare, went to camp immediately. When John LaBare confronted him, Turley readily admitted what he had done, expressed concern for his action, immediately packed and returned to Canada. We did tell him he was relieved of his duties and would not be reemployed. As far as the other people in the camp were concerned, they thought that he had been called back home because of family problems.

I could not recommend him for any position anywhere dealing with youth. The parents of the three boys agreed not to press charges if he would leave, but are quite prepared to do so if they hear of his involvement with Scouting.

I hope this will resolve the matter.

We, as concerned parents of Troop #514, Fountain Valley, California, sincerely regret to report to you on the following subject matter.

As discussed with both Mr. John LaBear and yourself on Tuesday, July 31, 1979, three Scouts from our Troop were fondled by Mr. Rick Turley, (the Scouting Program Director) during their stay at the Lost Valley Scout Reservation the week of July 21 through the 28th., 1979.

After delivering accolades to the fine staff for their exemplerary treatment of our Scouts during their stay, it is dissapointing, to say the least, to deliver aspirins over an incident as grave as this.

Because the three families involved (my son is included) are assured by you the the Boy Scouts of America are taking the required steps to eliminate this individual's contact with our organization, on a nationwide basis, we will not press charges. On the other hand, if we hear a decision to the contrary, we, as a group, will file criminal charges of child molesting against Mr. Rick Turley.
