

THE COURT: Good afternoon. The first matter we have is the matter of the People of the State of Michigan versus Thomas Michael Yoder. You want to step forward, sir?

MR. STIPES: Ready, your Honor.

(The defendant approached the Bench with

his attorney.)

THE COURT: Mr. Thomas Stipes is here on behalf of Mr. Yoder, and Mr. Yoder is present, and this is the date scheduled for the sentencing of Mr. Yoder.

Mr. Yoder, on August the 8th of 1974, a number of months ago, you entered a plea of guilty to Indecent Liberties, is that correct, sir?

THE DEFENDANT: Yes.

THE COURT: And I believe at that time you were advised that you had certain legal and Constitutional rights which included the right to counsel, and right to a trial, right to remain silent during the trial, right to have all the witnesses that had any information about this case brought into court at the time of the trial so that your attorney could question them, isn't that true, sir?

THE DEFENDANT: Yes, it was.

THE COURT: And were you also advised that you could be sentenced up to ten years in the state penitentiary or fined up to \$5,000 by the Court finding you guilty of this

particular offense?

THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir.

THE COURT: And is there any question but that you are guilty of this offense?

THE DEFENDANT: No, sir.

THE COURT: Now, Mr. Yoder, before I impose sentence, I might indicate that I have had several discussions with your counsel relative to this cause, but I have not discussed with you anything relative to this matter. Is there anything you wish to tell the Court?

THE DEFENDANT: No, sir, there isn't.

THE COURT: Mr. Stipes, other than what we have discussed, is there anything you wish to tell the Court?

MR. STIPES: Your Monor, I think in depth conversations in regard to the subject are pretty involved, and I know the Court's given this a great deal of consideration since in fact this was in fact six months ago up for sentencing. At that point and time the Court wanted more time for its consideration, which we deeply appreciate. I'm sure any sentence that the Court would hand down at this time would -- is a right sentence, and we have utmost faith in the Court, and I would only say, again, that Mr. Yoder has displayed to me during the last year a great deal of concern over this problem, and, as the pre-sentence report indicates, it was his own wish and desire to continue at the Genesee County Mental Mealth clinic,

even though they have indicated that there's nothing further that they can do for him, and they felt that he had made considerable progress with his problem, and I certainly think he has, and, in addition to that, I feel he's rehabilitated himself to remain on the streets and to be an active, productive citizen and provide for his wife and children.

THE COURT: Now, Mr. Yoder, you're still employed at Coca-Cola, is that right?

THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir, I am.

THE COURT: And you have worked with them

for quite a -- what is it? Nine years?

THE DEFENDANT: Will be ten years

September 13th of this year, sir.

THE COURT: And you're earning \$6.15 an

hour, is that right?

THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir. That's not

including my nighttime premium, which is another dime.

THE COURT: And that's your wife that's

with you this afternoon, is it not?

THE DEFENDANT: Yes, it is.

THE COURT: Mrs. Yoder, you want to step

forward?

(Mrs. Yoder approached the Bench.)

THE COURT: Mrs. Yoder, how are things going

at home now?

MRS. YODER: They seem to be going a lot better since we have both, you know, went to the mental health clinic and everything.

THE COURT: He's providing support for you

and the children?

MRS. YODER: Yes, he is.

THE COURT: And taking care of his

responsibilities?

MRS. YODER: Uh-huh.

of the seriousness of this offense, Mr. Yoder. It's true that you have an excellent work record. Your employer has indicated, quote that you are one of their better employees. As you have indicated, you have been with them for almost ten years; you're taking care of your family responsibilities, and one of the reasons we deferred this matter for sentencing was to see to it that you did consult with Genesee Community Mental Health

Services so that they could assist you in any fashion that they might, and, according to the case worker there, your attendance there has been regular, and that you have made excellent progress. So I'm going to take a chance on you, although by my taking a chance, that means I'm going to place you on probation, but if you violate your probation in any manner, you can still be sentenced up to ten years in the state penitentiary.

THE DEFENDANT: I understand that, sir.

THE COURT: Now, other than the difficulty that you had with the law back in 1958, it appears you have had no difficulty whatsoever for approximately sixteen, seventeen years until this particular offense, and I'm not a psychologist or psychiatrist to know what it is that causes you to get involved in this particular situation, but, as I have indicated I'm going to give you the benefit of the doubt, because during this interim period, you have complied with the Court's request

And the Judgment of Sentence should read

that:

JUDGMENT OF SENTENCE

- Thomas Michael Yoder was charged with the offense of Indecent Liberties.
- He entered a plea of guilty on August 8th of 1974, while being represented by Attorney Thomas Stipes.
- 3. The Court did accept the plea of guilty after ascertaining that it was made freely, voluntarily and understandingly, with full knowledge of his legal and Constitutional rights, and without undue influence, compulsion or duress, and without any promise of leniency.
- The date of sentence is the 1st day of April of 1975.
- 5. The sentence of this Court is that you be placed

on probation for a period of three years with the following special conditions:

- (1) You are to maintain full time employment and not leave that employment without permission from the Probation Department.
- (2) You are to live at your present residence or a residence approved by the Probation Department and not leave that residence without approval from the Probation Department.
- (3) You are to cooperate with any community agencies as directed by the Probation Department. Initially it will be the Genesee County Community Mental Health Services, and you are not to leave such program without written permission from the Probation Department.
- (4) You are to pay court costs in the amount of \$180 at the rate of \$5 or more per month while you are on probation.

DATE: A

THE COURT: Now, those are the four terms of probation that I'm going to require. Do you have any questions about those terms?

THE DEFENDANT: No, I have not.

THE COURT: I take it, then, you feel you can comply with those?

THE DEFENDANT: I definitely do, sir.

THE COURT: And you do understand if you violate your probation and it's shown that you have violated, you can still be sentenced up to ten years in the state penitentiary?

THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir.

THE COURT: I do want to state to you I hope I don't have the opportunity to have you before me again as a probation violator, but I want to warn you ahead of time if you don't comply with these terms of probation, it will be necessary for me to take a very serious look at this matter.

THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir.

THE COURT: Now, Mrs. Yoder, you have heard the terms of probation. Is there anything else you think ought to be added to the terms of probation, or do you think this can be worked out?

MRS. YODER: I think it can be worked out. THE COURT: I'm telling you, for your own benefit, that if your husband should stray for any particular reason in terms of violating these terms of probation, I would suggest that you contact Mr. Stipes or his probation officer so that something can be done before it's too late.

MRS. YODER: I will.

advise you, Mr. Yoder, that you have a Constitutional right to appeal the decision of this Court. If you are financially unable to provide an attorney to perfect such an appeal, the Court would provide counsel for you and furnish the attorney with whatever portions of the file would be necessary to perfect an appeal.

I further advise you if you claim financial inability and request the Court to appoint counsel, such request must be made within 60 days from today. I'm going to hand you a form which you should keep in the event you want to appeal, reminding you you have 60 days from today in which to file an appeal. The purpose of the form is to assist the Court in determining whether you are entitled to court-appointed counsel and to indicate to the Court whether in fact you want to appeal the decision of this Court.

This is a form that I would appreciate your signature on.

MR. STIPES: Your Honor -- I'm sorry.

THE COURT: Your signature is required as a form of a receipt indicating that you have been advised of your legal and Constitutional rights of appeal.

(The defendant signed the receipt.)

THE COURT: If there are no other questions

that will be all, Mr. Yoder.

MR. STIPES: Thank you, your Honor.

THE DEFENDANT: Thank you, sir.

THE COURT: You're welcome.
