
Dear Paul:

This is regarding Joseph P. Kolp, Jr. (not Joseph F. as I wrote previously) in my original letter to you concerning his misconduct and our relieving him of any responsibility in Scouting. I do not have anything in writing other than what I am going to put below.

On Friday night, July 12, I met with Mr. Kolp and Chuck Bond, who is Chief of the Pipestone organization in our Council. Prior to this meeting, I met with [redacted], a 19-year old member of our camp staff, and Dave Durell, our Camp Director. [redacted] had confided in Durell and Dave had asked me to meet with them to hear [redacted]'s story. The incident happened when [redacted] was 16 years old while on an outing to our new camp with the Pipestone group to clear trails. Mr. Kolp and [redacted] were the only two who went. They did some work and then camped overnight in an area near camp. During the overnight camping experience, they drank beer and vodka and played strip poker. Toward the end of the card game, Mr. Kolp took Polaroid pictures of [redacted]. [redacted] told us that because of so much drinking, he got sick, went out of the tent, and then came back in and did not pass out, but laid down feeling very lousy. He said that he was sexually molested at that time and that nothing else happened the remainder of the event. They went home the next day. [redacted] also indicated that he was afraid to talk to anyone about the incident, although he did visit with two different psychologists because of the guilt feelings he had. He said he came forward now because he was approached again by Mr. Kolp to go on a weekend water skiing trip. I told Mr. Kolp of these allegations, and he admitted that he had contributed to the delinquency of a minor through the purchase of beer and vodka, that he did play strip poker, and that he did take pictures of [redacted] in the nude. He said that he did not assault him sexually. Both Mr. Bond and myself felt that there was enough admitted charges to deny him registration in our organization, and we both have strong feelings that he did not tell the truth about the assault.

Hope this is of help.

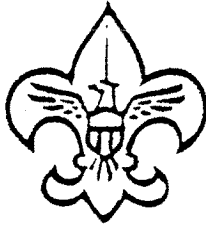

This is to inform you that a volunteer Scouter who was registered in our Council and in the Great Trail Council should no longer be registered as an adult Scouter. His name is Joseph F. Kolb, Jr., 317 West Fifth Street, North Canton, OH 44720. His phone number is (216) 499-7005. He is white, approximately 28 years old, and single.

A young man on our Camp Staff met with me a short time ago with some very strong charges against Mr. Kolb. I met with him last Friday and reviewed the allegations. He admitted doing many of them, but denied any sexual contact with the young man. There are no legal charges pending, but I feel he has definitely contributed to the delinquency of a minor and could be prosecuted and found guilty if charges were brought forth. He has agreed to terminate his membership in Scouting.

If you need anything further, please let me know. I have also enclosed a copy of a news clipping that appeared in our local newspaper May 10, 1985. We sent a copy of this article to the Communications Division as part of the on-going public relations information requested by the National Office.

Canton man enjoys sharing, teaching benefits of scouting

JOE CANTON — Anytime you spend about 1,000 hours a year for nothing, you're a masochist, right? Or you're a textbook enthusiast, right?
 Joe Kolp, 28, of 317 W. Fifth St., is a masochist. He just happens to love the time he devotes to scouting every year.
 He was introduced to scouting in 1963 at the age of 12 in North Canton. He earned his Eagle Scout award and then he had six palins. It takes five years to get a palin after graduation from Hoover High School in 1975, he enrolled at Case Western Reserve University and graduated in electrical engineering. In about

three weeks, he will receive a master's degree. He is a project engineer at Goodyear Aerospace in Akron.
 But, despite all the hours spent in studying, research and hard work, he never turned his back on the time he allotted to helping youth.
 "I think it (scouting) did a lot for me. I just want to give other kids the opportunities I had."
 On April 25, Joe was presented with the William H. Spurgeon III Award, the highest national scouting honor. It recognizes outstanding contributions to America's youth through the Explorer program, which is the division of the Boy Scouts serving youths ages 14 through 18.
 Joe is associated with not one, but two, councils. The Great Trails

Council serves Summit, Portage, Medina and Wayne counties, and the Buckeye Council encompasses Stark, Carroll, Harrison and Tuscarawas counties.
 In Great Trails, he is an advisor to the Explorer Presidents' Association as well as advisor of the Engineering Explorer Post at Goodyear. On the council level, he is a council commissioner and helps coordinate all the posts within the council.
 In the Buckeye Council, he is a camp master and runs the weekend camping program during the winter season at Camp Tuscarora. He is on the committee of the new scout reservation in Carroll County, recently purchased by the Buckeye Council. "I'm helping with the scouting work

and we hope to be able to open it in 1980 or 1987."
 Joe averages 16 hours per week in scouting, plus two weeks during the summer at camp. I guess that's about a thousand hours per year. I don't plan on ever giving it up. When I retire, I plan to become a Scoutmaster.
 Kolp says kids have two perceptions of scouting. "Boy Scouting is adventuresome. You spend a lot of time in the outdoors, learning outdoor skills. At the Explorer level, you are more or less looking at a career, a particular career. The sharp kids recognize this and realize the benefits it offers them."
 Explorer scouting is non-uniform. "We don't run around in khaki clothes, contrary to popular belief. At my post at Goodyear, we

explore the career of electrical engineering. By the time a kid is a senior in high school, he has a pretty good idea if engineering is his bag, and through all our projects, he is certainly well advanced of most of his peers when he enters college."
 You would think that all the hours Joe spends working and in scouting would make him a Johnnie One Note, but in contrast, in his spare time, he is all a new sound. He also likes water skiing, snow skiing and yachting. He owns a boat and rides his motorcycle in the summer. He can also be found publishing software for the Goodyear company. He has his main hobby in electronics and computers.
